NEW LAW IN EFFECT JULY 1

OREGON COMPENSATION LAW PASSED BY LAST LEGISLATURE, BECOMES OPERATIVE SOON.

The Oregon compensation law which was passed by the last legislature, becomes a law on July 1st, and the State Industrial Accident Commission has just issued a bulletin furnishing information upon its purpose and operation. The bulletin says:

"The Oregon compensation law was passed at the 1913 session of the state legislature, approved by the special election held in November of the same year, and becomes operative as an insurance measure July 1, 1914. The administration of the law is in charge of a commission of three members, representing the employer, the workman and the state.

"The law represents a radical departure from the employer's liability law, under which employer claims because of work accidents, have been settled in the past. Under the liability law, compensation was made upon the basis of 'Whose fault caused the accident.' If the employee could be proved to be at fault, he had to pay—if he could not, he escaped payment.

"Many accidents are due to the dangers inherent in the industry itself—such as the dangers inseparable from the operation of high-speed machinery, the use of powder, the handling of heavy materials, and the hazards of construction. A large part of the accidents would not occur if men were not working in dangerous places and with dangerous things. Workmen have been unable to secure compensation in many cases where they were not to blame at all, but where the accident was solely due to the risks inevitable in modern industry.

"Under the Oregon compensation law, if any workman covered by the act is hurt, he is compensated from the State Industrial Accident Fund in a definite amount, without litigation or cost to the injured workman, and regardless of whose fault caused the accident.

"The law is of the 'presumptive objective' type. No employer or employee is compelled to come under the compensation act, but, unless notice of rejection is given, both employer and employees in the industries to which it applies, are presumed to have elected to come under it. Employers who refuse to come under the act are stripped of the defenses known as 'assumption of risk,' 'fellow servant,' and 'contributory negligence' and workmen rejecting the act are deprived of its benefits.

"Employers are presumed to have elected to abide by the provisions of the law unless they notify the Commission on or before June 15, 1914, and workmen have opportunity to reject the act by notifying their employers, in writing, on or before June 30.

"Occupations subject to law: Factories, mills and workshops where machinery is used; printing, electro-

typing, photographing and stereotyping; public works where machinery is used; foundries, blast furnaces, mines, wells, gas works, water works, reduction works, breweries, elevators, wharves, docks, dredges, smelters, powder works, laundries operated by power; quarries, engineering works; logging, street and interurban railroads not engaged in interstate commerce; buildings being constructed, repaired, moved or demolished; telegraph, telephone, electric light or power plants, or lines, steam heating or power plants, railroads not engaged in interstate commerce, steam boats, tugs and ferries."

"Compensation for temporary disability will be paid at the following rate for periods not exceeding six months, providing amounts stated do not exceed 60 per cent of workman's wages. (After six months the permanent total disability schedule will apply):"

"Compensation for permanent partial disability, (cases where there is some permanent injury, but not sufficient to entirely incapacitate from earning), will be paid on the basis of \$25.00 per month according to the following schedule:	
Loss of thumb, 24 mos.	\$300.00
Loss of 1st finger, 16 mos.	400.00
Loss of 2nd finger, 9 mos.	225.00
Loss of 3rd finger, 8 mos.	200.00
Loss of 4th finger, 6 mos.	150.00
Loss of great toe, 10 mos.	250.00
Loss of other toe, 4 mos.	100.00
Loss of one phalange of thumb equal to loss of one-half of thumb.	
Loss of one phalange of finger equal to loss of one-third of finger. Loss of two phalanges of finger equal to loss of one half of finger. Loss of more than one phalange of thumb, or more than two phalanges of finger equal to loss of entire thumb or finger.	
Loss of arm, 96 mos.	\$2,400.00
Loss of hand, 76 mos.	1,900.00
Loss of leg, 88 mos.	2,200.00
Loss of foot, 64 mos.	1,600.00
Loss of hearing, both ears	2,400.00
Loss of hearing, one ear	1,200.00

"Payments for permanent total disability, (which consists of loss of both legs, or both arms, or one leg and one arm, total loss of eyesight, paralysis, or other condition permanently incapacitating a workman from performing work at any gainful occupation), will be made during the period of disability as follows:

	Per Month
Single	\$30.00
Married (wife or invalid husband)	35.00
(Total monthly payment not to exceed \$50.00.)	

"In addition to burial expenses not exceeding \$100.00, payments on account of death of a workman will be paid as follows:

	Per Month
Widow or invalid widower, for life or until remarriage	\$30.00
Additional for each child	6.00
Orphan child until 16	15.00
Total monthly payment not to exceed	\$50.00.

"Upon remarriage of widow, lump sum of \$300.00 is paid once and for all, but payments to children continue until they reach the age of 16 years. If a workman leave no widow or child under the age of 16 years, but leaves a dependent or dependents, a monthly payment will be made to each dependent equal to 50 per cent of the average monthly support actually received by dependent from the workman during the twelve months next preceding the occurrence of the injury, but the total payment to all dependents may not exceed \$50.00 per month."

Notice to Contractors.

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received for Clearing and Grading the Bear Creek-Bandon Road from Bear Creek toward Bandon according to the amended plat and specifications prepared by the County Road Master and on file in the office of the County Clerk.

A certified check for five per cent. of the amount of the bid to be deposited with the County Clerk with bid, to be forfeited to the County in case contract shall be awarded and the contractor shall fail to neglect or refuse for a period of ten days after such award is made to enter into a contract and file his bond to the satisfaction of the County Court as required by law.

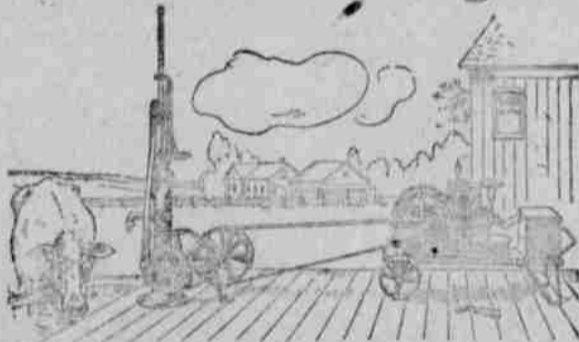
