WAR IS SURELY ALL THAT GENERAL SHERMAN SAID

(Oregon City Courier) "Give me some of that sugar like I got last week; I guess you might as well make it another sack, please," said the Perfect Lady to her groceryman.

"Yes ma'am, it will be \$7," said the groceryman. "Seven dollars? Why I only paid five dollars and twenty cents for it last week, don't you remember?"

"But this is the same sugar that you got a carload of, isn't it?" protested the Perfect Lady. "And you sold me some of that carload at fifty-two. Do you have to pay more for the balance of the carload that is in your warehouse?"

The Groceryman compressed his lips. "Our sugar is now \$7.00 a sack," was all he said.

Funny isn't it? War breaks out in Europe. Under the neutrality rules, provisions are contraband, and so cannot be shipped from this country to the warring nations.

Yet the sugar was bought before the war was started, most of the meat was killed before the war was started and the shoes were sold to the retailers and paid for long before the war started.

Over in Great Britain, in Germany and France, where the pinch of war really comes, the government has prohibited the raising of prices on foodstuffs. Grocers and butchers who try to gouge their patrons will be shot or imprisoned, the orders say.

This is an interesting condition of affairs. Pretty soon the prices of guns and cartridges will go up here too. When trade is open to the whole world and when the United States sells to Europe, prices are down.

English News Suppressed. London—Earl Bitchour, British Secretary of State for War, today notified the press that any newspaper publishing news of naval or military movements except that issued by the official bureau would be suspended.

German General Suicides. London—The reports of the suicide of General Von Emmich, who led the German troops into Belgium, has been confirmed. He left a message to his wife saying: "I know Liege is to be my tomb but I prefer to die by my own hand."

Prune Crop Is Short. Roseburg—The prune crop of Douglas county will be two weeks earlier this year than usual. Already ripe Italians are being offered on the local markets and drying will begin about August 20th.

No Socialists Executed. London—A report direct from Germany states that there have been no executions of Socialists there. The report says that Dr. Liebnicht and hundreds of thousands of Socialists are on the battle field fighting for their country.
