Portland-Within the next 30 da the Brookings Timebr \& Lumber Company's plant at Brookings, Curry ,County, one of the finest in
dustrial plants in the state, will be dustrial plants in the state, will be
ready for operation. This was anready for operation. This was
nounced by Superintendent P. Shropshire, who is in Portland for few days on business connected he opening of the new industry. Taking the new enterprise in its
various departments, it is the most mportant investment venture in th ection of the state. Brookings is 1 cated about six miles north of the Cal ifornia line on an open harbor on the
coast, and until the Brookings intercoast, and untiine Brookings inter
ests began their preliminary opera esta began their preliminary opera-
tions there it was one of the most iso lated and forbidding portions of al andeveloped Oregon.
Now, however, the men behind th great project, involving an investmen
of capital running up into the millions are about ready to open one of the most up-to-date lumber plants on the coast; they are laying out a complete townsite; they are building network of first class standariguage ralroads; they are developng facilites; they will market their lum ber in their own bottoms; they hav their own tubine plant for generating electricity, which will be used exclumany enterprises.
The sawmill, which is one of the finest possible construction, with reinforced concrete foundations, floors
and supports, will have a totaf capa and supports, will have a total capa-
city of 250,00 feet a day, and will be a permanent plant emplaying from 250 to 300 men a day.
The company owns about $35,9,0$
acres of land in Curry county, most o acres of land in Curry county, most
which is heavily timbered with highgrade fir, the estimated holdings in cluding over $2,000,000,000$ feet of
merchantable timber.

improved lines, with its entire equipment and machinery of the latest an best. The townsite is being laid out

camps and the camps themselves. We shall shp our lumber in our own ves-

devices will be the best that can be installed. We shall have our own e
lectric plant and water supply and oneo $f$ the most important enterprises
in connection with the operation of the sawmill will be the large concrete dam 100 feet long and 75 feet high, which will give us a log pond of 20 acres only one side of the mill, and will cut about 125,000 feet a day until we get the other side completed."
