### MYRTLE POINT NEWS

From the Enterprise:

Work was commenced last week on the improvement project on the county road between the North Fork bridge and the foot of Spruce street. The highway, we understand, is to have a 16-foot roadway of water-bound macadam.

Dott, the little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Tripp of Bandon, suffered a broken arm while at play last Friday at the Chas. Butler home near this city where the family was visiting. The children were jumping rope when the accident occurred.

Howard Lawless, son of W. E. Lawless, died at the family home near Gravel Ford, on Monday afternoon, August 31, 1914.

Roberts will move to the Planagan & Bennett bank building where they will open offices under the firm name of Roberts & Roberts.

called into Port Orford Thursday morning and sailed Friday evening with 12,000 railroad ties. From here she went to North Bend, where she will finish her load with lumber and then sail for Santa Anna, California.

A band of some 450 sheep passed down the coast Sunday. They had been bought in the northern end of the county for Isham Walker, and were being driven to Eureka, Calif.

The Port Orford Wharf company is building a 24x40 foot warehouse at the shore end of their new dock. This building will be really larger than is needed at the present time, but the company is building with an eye to the future. J. W. Mackenzie of Sixes is in charge of the work.

Considerable improvement and building has been going on in Port Orford during the past few days. A. A. Jamieson has completed his cottage, D. Quellen has a new barn up, Wm. Gillings and C. W. Zumwalt have put new sidings on the south side of their buildings and E. L. White's new residence and the warehouse are under construction.

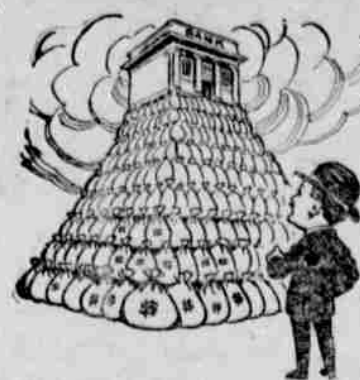
