"LUCILLE LOVE"

The 13th installment of "Lucille Love," the girl of mystery, will be shown at the Grand Wednesday, Sept. 16. In the last installment Lucille had just escaped from Loubeque's Mexican ranch, and in the spy's automobile and driven by his chauffeur, she was flying towards the American line, closely pursued by Loubeque and his gang. The country is rough and the roads are rough and in bad shape. Loubeque can better stand the rough handling than the girl, and as a consequence he gains on her rapidly. Knowing what his fate will be if Loubeque overtakes him, Lucille's chauffeur loses his head while driving the machine over a dugway. The night which the spy then witnesses freezes his blood and causes him to cover his eyes that he may see no more.
