Forest Notes

A great deal of the oak used on the Pacific coast comes from the eastern part of Asia.

To guard against tree repair factories or quick tree surgeons, the Massachusetts forestry association will inspect the shade trees belonging to its members, free of charge.

The Sitka, or city forest of Zurich, Switzerland, adds to the town revenue \$7.20 per acre a year, reducing the amount needed to be raised through taxation by more than \$3,000.

In northern Idaho and Montana, which also may live during the past winter, 25 per cent of the trees on mountain forests were caused by rats, and 25 per cent by beavers, and the remainder was due to brush burning and other miscellaneous or unknown cause.

A mountain lion recently killed in the Grand Canyon game preserve, which follows the Tappan national forest, measured two feet from nose to tail. Mountain lions and other kinds of prey, such as wolves, coyotes and wild cats are killed by forest officers and game wardens because they are a menace to stock and to game animals.
