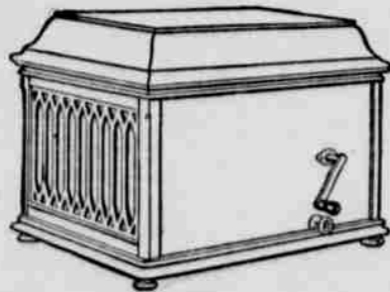

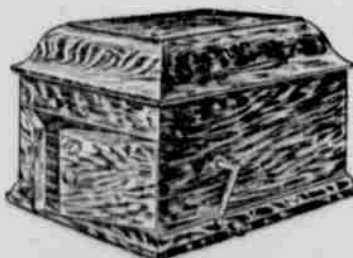

## MOOSE OPEN CLUB ROOMS

The local chapter of the Loyal Order of Moose are now installed in their new quarters in the second story of Concrete Hall, over the O. A. Trowbridge's store, and can be said to have one of the most complete, if not the most complete lodge and club rooms in Coos county.

In the front of the building is a large club room, fitted out with special emphasis on whatever would add to the comfort and convenience of the members of the order, is a large table well laden with newspapers and magazines and other reading matter and surrounded by deep comfortable chairs. This is the lounging room of the establishment and all of its details carry out the lounging idea; there are plenty of deep, soft cushioned chairs for everybody, cards and card tables for those who wish to pass away time with the pastebords a billiard and pool table for those whose tastes run more to trials of skill and there is an abundance of light and air in the room at all times. Wall and chandelier positions for the electric lights distribute the light in uniformity and the light cream shading of the walls gives the room a cheerful appearance.

To the rear of the club room the lodge room features the same arrangement as to the lights and decorations and is arranged so as to serve for social unctons as well as lodge work. Folding dinin gtables are provided for this room, which when not in use are stored in a room at the back. On the east of the main room and connected with it by a serving window is the kitchen, fitted up to be of special convenience for card parties and other social gatherings that may be held in the main room.

These will be the quarters of the Moose until such time as they see fit to build their own building on their property at the west end of First Street, which will probably be at least two years from the present time.

On the honeymoon trip to Paris the blight of insanity touched the mind of the young husband and all the efforts of the best physicians in Europe failed to cure him. For ten years he has remained there.

Mrs. Breckenridge recently brought the young son of the marriage, John Breckenridge, Jr., to San Francisco to be with his grandmother, and with her concurrence the annulment proceedings are now under way here and in Paris.
