Big Special Feature To Be Shown Here

The New York Hippodrome is to be brought to Bandon, this through the presentation on the arena of that giant of the nation's amusement institutions of the spectacular creation of America. The production is a moving picture triumph, filming which would not have been possible any where except in the Hippodrome.

An elephant opens the Hippodrome entertainment "America" by bowing "How d'ye do" to the audience and closes the show by nodding "good by".

There is a wonderful invention utilized in America that permits scores and scores of pretty girls to walk in to the famous Hippodrome tank and disappear, remaining under water for a period of ten minutes.

Over 500 stage hands are required to manipulate scenery and properties for the moving picture production of America.

The New York Hippodrome is open for forty weeks in the season giving two performances a day, and playing to an average of 12,000 people every 24 hours, making a total of 2,880,000 people, almost equal to the entire population of Greater New York who attend the Hippodrome every year.

A very interesting fact in connection with the film production of America is that it could not have been made anywhere else on earth except in the mammoth New York Hippodrome. The vast size and admirable equipment, together with the military-like discipline maintained in every department of the institution made it possible to do that which anywhere else would have proved a waste of time. The filming of America is to the cinematograph industry what the construction of the Panama canal is to the science of engineering and reflects only the highest credit on those responsible for its realization.
