### A Place Worth Visiting

#### Doing Up the Week's Wash in a Few Minutes, Bigger Ice Machine

The driver from the Bandon Laundry is now mixing up the cutting and distribution of ice cakes with the collection of soiled clothes and the distribution of the cleaned up product.

The new ice plant at the laundry was set to work last Saturday and is now turning out its sixtyfive cakes every other day.

It is an interesting thing to see these cans of water with the yards and rods of twisting pipes put in during the month past by Plumber C. I. Starr and the pump which keeps the freezing solution circulating on its mission to congeal.

There is considerable interest in the laundry too to any one who has never seen the weeks wash, washed, dried and ironed in a couple of hours. There are two large washing machines, like combined churns only these reverse themselves; turn just so far and then go back for a new start. The water that feeds the churn and from which the ice is made comes from a spring on the side hill and it is sufficiently soft that the suds sweep out through the openings in the washer like the collar on a stein of Heidelberg. It is used in ice-making and the laundry manager volunteers the information that the water is better to drink than the city water.

Feb soap that produces the suds is liquid and is made on the ground. Lye and tallow refuse from the city market go to make up the product the connecting elements being a fat and

a kettle.

The laundry drier reminds one of a cream separator. The copper bowl is larger and the moisture flies out through perforations at the side instead of rising to the top. The wash is whirled so rapidly that the clothes are dry enough to iron in a very few minutes.

The larger pieces are smoothed on a large steam heated roller which turns with them until the moisture is evaporated. Smaller pieces have special ironing machines, one for collars, another for neck bands, another for shirt bosoms and the more complicated and particular ironing is done by hand with electric irons.

It is worth any one's while to go through this institution and see the way in which the work is done.

### Story of the Old South

Multiple Reel Subject Visualizing Booth Tarkington's Story by the Lasky Feature Play Company.

Reviewed by W. Stephen Bush "Cameo Kirby," a screened replica of the wellknown play, fully maintains its native flavor on the film. There is no doubt about the popularity of the film play with a genuine American theme and atmosphere. Audiences cannot get enough of them.

The atmosphere of the play is charming. It brings us back to the heyday of Southern prosperity when the planter ruled the land. Upon the broad back of the Mississippi plied innumerable watercraft; most famous among such craft was the Mississippi steamboat, with its picturesque captain and crew, its gamblers and sporting men and its overweening ambition to surpass the speed of all its rivals. Part of the story takes place on board of one of these famous steamers which looks as if it had come back from the days of another generation. The oft told expedition of having a "nigger" sit on the safety valve is shown and brings a gust of laughter.

Dustin Farnum is an ideal Cameo Kirby. The chivalry, the manhood, the gallantry of the old South shine forth convincingly in his delineation of the lovable character of Cameo Kirby. There was not a false note, not a misplaced emotion, the whole production is deserving of the highest praise. It was a difficult part to portray, but an extremely grateful

one, for when rendered with skill the role of Cameo Kirby is very sure to make a strong appeal to the audience. The ensemble supporting Mr. Farnum was good and aids in making the picture seem life-like.

The story furnished by the master pen of Booth Tarkington is strong and well sustained.
