AVENGE WILSON'S FALSE NEUTRALITY SAYS BERLIN

LONDON—"Berlin has given German headquarters in New York the order to vote for Hughes, to be revenged on Wilson," says a Daily Express dispatch from Copenhagen. "The German-Americans now have an opportunity to repay Wilson for his false neutrality and the unprecedented attacks on their Americanism," the Cologne Gazette says.

Other newspaper remind Germans in America that it was Wilson who invented the insulting expression, "Hyphenated Americans," and suggests that he should be "strafed" by a decisive American vote. The anti-Wilson campaign will be encouraged from Berlin by every means, including unaided money.

FIRST SUPPLY CARGO IN WEEKS REACHES BANDON

The first cargo of fresh fruits, vegetables, hay and grain and other supplies to reach this port from San Francisco since the longshoremen's strike was declared, nearly a month ago, came in on the Acme which arrived from the south Sunday, yesterday and today the stores have been swamped with orders for peaches, plums and apricots, a quantity of which made up part of the Acme's cargo.

There are still large amounts of goods on the San Francisco docks which were consigned to Bandon merchants before the strike was declared. Other local freight from the south has been routed to Marshfield where it is arriving on the steamers Breakwater and Kilburn, and is being trans-shipped here by way of Coquille.
