Saturday, October 9th, the grim reaper claimed one of Bandon's pioneers, Mrs. Emma Osborn. The

lady was at the L. P. Sorensen home when she was stricken with an attack of heart trouble, dying within a few minutes. She had been apparently in the best of health and her death came as a distinct shock.

She had been a resident of this section for twenty-eight years, all but a few of which had been spent in Bandon. Deceased was born at Dayton, Ohio, July 7th, 1849. Her parent moved to Iowa three years later where she grew to womanhood. In 1867 she married Albert Osborn, to which union three children were born. The young couple moved to Arkansas from Iowa, coming to this state in 1877. They moved to Coos county about 28 years ago. Her husband and one son, Spray, reside in Canada. Two sons, Elmer and Lester reside in this city.

Funeral services were held at the Presbyterian church Sunday after-

noon and interment was in the K. of P. cemetery.

Reverend W. S. Smith, pastor of the Presbyterian church, who paid a fitting tribute to the sterling qualities of the deceased, preached the funeral sermon.
