The Breakwater has been tied up indefinitely at Coos Bay instead of at Oakland, as was reported, and 24 of her crew left Marshfield on the Kilburn Monday for Portland.

Jas. Dunn, who wanted to carve up the populace of Coos Bay with a big butcher knife the other day was tried in the County court this

week and found insane. He was committed to Salem.

Construction crews have begun work on both ends of the line along the Willamette-Pacific railroad putting up poles and wires for the Western Union Telegraph company. The line had been completed as far as Cushman.

Motion of the defendants in the

case of Frederick Macleay versus Alfred Miller to dismiss the suit in equity regarding boundary lines on the Rogue where the Seaborg cannery is located has been allowed by Judge Calkins.

Westerly swells have been breaking on the Coos Bay bar for several days and when the Kilburn crossed in Monday from the south she took

three big seas over the stern. On the last trip out the same boat shipped nine seas and a portion of the forward rail on the bow was carried away.
