

ANS are under way in San Francisco to preserve the splendid Palace of Fine Arts as a legacy of the world's most beautiful Exposition. This splendid building rivals any architectural creation of present or past eras. It was pronounced by Lord Richard Neville, emissary of King George of England, as one of the two most beautiful buildings in the world, the other being the Taj Mahal, in India.

During'the time of the English occupation he was one of the many oriental potentates who lost caste and title. Ultimately he was shot for treason and his property taken over by the authorities. In diverse ways it traveled through India to Persia, where it was purchased by an American girl in Teheran. This young American afterward became the wife of a Servian count.
