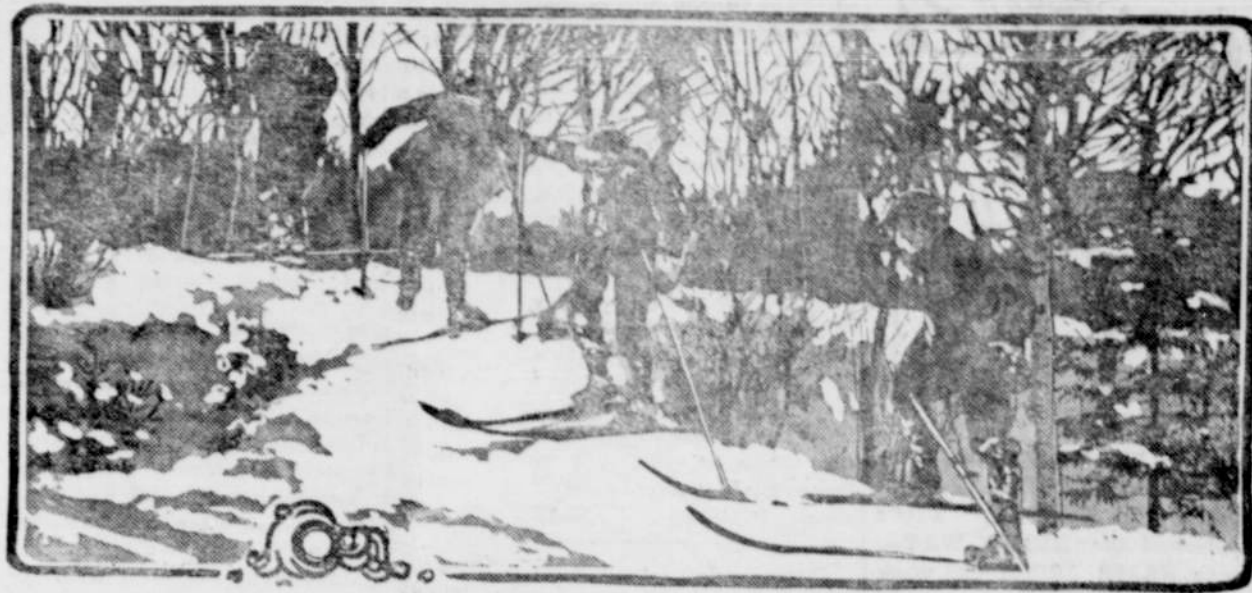

Timber Resources of The National Forests

Much Timber from National Forests Used by Settlers, Prospectors, and Others.

In his annual report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1915, just issued, the secretary of agriculture devotes considerable space to the timber resources of the National forests. He makes it very plain that the "resources of the forests are being utilized to build up the country."

The secretary says that the forests "furnish the timber required by settlers, communities, and industries within and near their boundaries. This is obtained without charge by settlers, prospectors, and other local residents for personal use; at cost by settlers and farmers generally for domestic purposes; and at market value by individuals or corporations desiring to purchase it. During the last 11 years the number of permits for free timber to settlers has multiplied 13 times, and the number of sales 27 times. The amount cut annually by settlers under these permits is more than four times what it was in 1905, while that under commercial sales has increased eight times. Probably not less than 45,000 persons or corporations obtained timber directly from the national forests."

The secretary further states that "more than half of the timber now cut annually is used in the vicinity of the forests. This includes all that takes free and under sales at cost, and approximately 45 per cent of the commercial cut. Hundreds of mining districts throughout the west, from small projects requiring occasional wagon loads of props or lagging to great copper districts of central Montana, which consume about 380,000 pieces of mining timber annually, are supplied. Railroads also are furnished a large part of the ties and other material required for their lines in the Rocky mountain regions. A million and a half ties are now cut from the forests yearly."

In conclusion the secretary points out that "the national forests also meet the demands of the general market. More than 300,000,000 feet are cut annually for the nation-wide trade. Since 1908 there have been taken from them 5,000,000,000 board feet of wood and timber products."

"THE COST OF HIGH LIVING" IS GREAT

Department of Agriculture Finds Average American Family is Very Wasteful.

The Federal government conducts a good many kinds of investigations in these days of paternalism, but Washington was hardly prepared to learn that the United States agents had been digging into the garbage dumps of the country, says the National Tribune of Washington, D. C. As a result of this latest inquiry the department announces it has established the fact that the national capital is the most wasteful city in the United States. In making the survey careful examinations were made of the contents of garbage cans by the garbage can squad with a view to determining what percentage of food products daily thrown away by housewives might have been put to wholesome use had the housewives of the various cities conducted their establishments more economically.

The results were surprising. It has been said many times over that the French could very easily live on the food that the average family throws away, and there is a great deal to support this statement, particularly in a great population which

has often been sarcastically mentioned as "living in paper bags." Real economic living undoubtedly comes from being able to take care of the "left overs" and putting them to good use for another meal.

The registration in Coos county two years ago next spring showed 2,024 voters in the North Bend, Marshfield, Bunker Hill and Cooston precincts. It also showed 2,204 voters in the Bandon, Coquille and Myrtle Point precincts. But while it gave 3,694 voters in the precincts in the Coquille watershed, it showed only 3,014 in the Coos Bay section and the county north of it. Judging from the returns for school enumeration just completed the majority at the south end will be considerably greater in 1916.—Coquille Sentinel.

The Wedderburn Trading Company is having a wharf and warehouse built on the Gold Beach side at Rogue river. One of the cement hatchery tanks at the old mill rock will be used as the foundation for the building, and the wharf will be immediately in front of it. 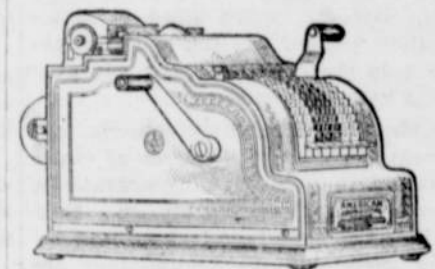
