HIGH COST OF HUNTING

Many Two and Four Mile People Lose Animals as Result of Promiscuous Shooting.

Everyone has heard of the "high cost of living" or any of its different versions, but few, aside from the man who invests in a hunting outfit and paraphernalia, ever heard of the "high cost of somebody else's hunting" more forcibly than several of the farmers of the Two and Four Mile sections.

It appears this section of the state, although it prides itself on being a frontier section, has a considerable number of tenderfoot hunters, who are prone to shoot at anything that moves or has the appearance of wild game—and the ranchers' live stock has suffered in consequence.

At Two Mile the Richert Bros. lost a team of 3 year old horses and a yearling calf, all three animals being found in the woods with bullet holes through their bodies. A Mr. Smith had a horse shot in the knee a short while ago and will probably have to kill the animal as after considerable doctoring he has but little hopes of restoring the use of the animal's leg. Shortly after the opening of the hunting season animals were reported killed in the Four Mile section, but at this time as to who they belonged cannot be recalled.
