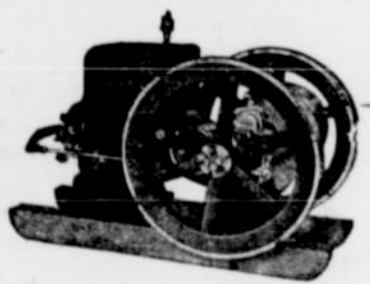

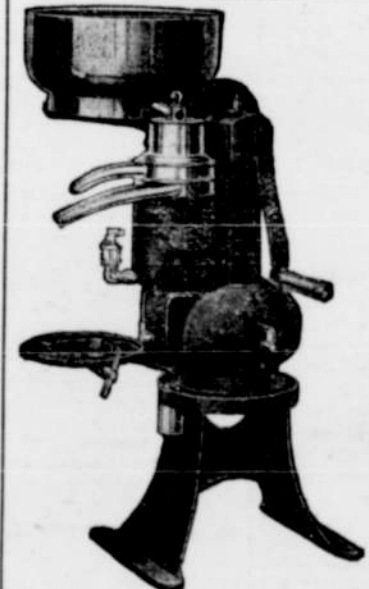

DESCRIPTION:

A glance at the cut will show the "SIMPLEX" to be a compact, heavy and substantial Separator. It is a broad, solid base and a body or frame of pleasing design that entirely encloses the gearing and all moving parts. The supply-can is located conveniently and out of the way of the operator, and at a convenient height. No attempt has been made towards a "low down" supply-can at the expense of other good features. The supply-can of the "SIMPLEX" is at the right height, 41 to 43 inches from the floor. The crank is also at the correct height, 34 inches, and not from 30 to 32 inches as in other machines. The "SIMPLEX" can be operated standing, which is better than a stooping position. All oil-holes are provided with spring-top oil-cups, which hold enough oil for an ordinary run and protect the bearings from dust or wet. All waste oil drains to the oil-pan, and thence to the oil-drip-can---no oil or slop can reach the floor. The base is open, so the floor can be cleaned under the machine. The "SIMPLEX" is a clean and sanitary machine. The most striking feature of the new "SIMPLEX" is its light running. The 1100-lb. size, when at speed and skimming milk, takes no more power than the ordinary 500-lb. Hand Separator of other makes. It opens up a distinctively new field for the large Hand Separator. It cuts the labor of skimming the milk more than in two, not only because it turns easier, but because it does the work in half the time; and in these busy days, where labor is scarce and expensive, a saving in time is a direct saving in money to the dairyman.
