Splendid patriotic sentiment is expressed in the remarks of C. R. Wade, made at the unfurling of the Bandon municipal flag, July 4th. They are quoted herewith in full:

"Three hundred years ago there was planted on the Atlantic shores of America, the germ of a new idea.

"There it took root and grew, slowly and unconsciously at first, but nevertheless as surely, as steadily, and as sturdily as an oak, until seventeen hundred and seventy-six, when the Motherland sought to suppress and eradicate that idea, at first by persuasion, then by legislation, and finally by military force.

"Her efforts were met by a firm refusal, then a stubborn resistance, and finally by open defiance. Military efforts to eradicate THAT idea, was like adding a draught of air to a smothered fire. In vigor and in fury it burst forth, and for the first time it assumed a definite form, and was clothed in words, and was heralded broadcast, bearing to the astonished world the defiant message of humanity's new doctrine, namely the doctrine that 'all governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed,' and that doctrine as written in Declaration of Independence was then and there subscribed to by no less than thirteen several, separate, independent and sovereign powers, each one of whom pledged and then gave their sons to the common defense of that doctrine.

"And those sons! They lived and fought and suffered together, and together they bled, and together they saved to posterity by a timely victory that idea—that doctrine 'that all governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed.'

"For one hundred and forty years, and more, that idea has flourished and it has grown and expanded and penetrated to the remotest corners of the earth, and humanity has been encouraged, and cherished and influenced by it.

"But there exists in the world today the antithesis of that idea—the idea that an autocratic government is a divine gift, rightly secured by the accident of birth and heredity, and that the will of the autocrat who rules, is paramount to the will of the majority of his subjects, and that the reins of government, under the benediction of divine permission, are merely the instrumentalities for personal aggrandizement.

"These two opposing ideas cannot exist in close proximity without a conflict, and so, by a gradual process, little by little and one by one,

with accrued interest thereon will be paid upon presentation at my office in the City of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, to-wit: No. 16, dated Feb. 1, 1914; No. 17, dated Feb. 1, 1914; No. 18, dated Feb. 1, 1914; No. 19, dated Feb. 1, 1914.

"And so, the very least we can do at this time, which seems like a calm preceding the fury of the impending storm, is to assemble here this Declaration anniversary day, and reaffirm our allegiance, and dedicate with our prayers that idea three centuries old, and here set up and unfurl to the breeze on the Pacific shores of America the visible emblem of our faith, the visible emblem of that idea, the beautiful and the glorious Stars and Stripes.

"May the sons of our government, and of the Allies, and the sons of humanity wipe monarchy from the face of the earth forever, that your children and my children, and our children's children may have and enjoy that peace and security which we crave, and may Old Glory with her thirteen stripes, represent not to us alone, but to the thirteen allies as well, and to all humanity those ideals which cannot perish, those ideals for which so many have died, and will die, but not in vain, and may democracy—our democracy, the kind represented by our flag—become the watchword, not of our own national peace and security alone, but the watchword of a lasting world peace as well, and thereby secure to us, to all people, and to all humanity the blessings of Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."
