I, Mayor of the City of Bandon, have the honor to submit here- for the City. with recommendations and estimates for the expenses of the City of Bandon together with necessary funds to be raised to meet said expenses for the fiscal year, beginning Oct. 1st., 1918, and ending September 30th. 1919, the same being submitted under the provisions of Section 61 Page 22 of the City Charter and under the provisions and requirements of Chapter 234 General Laws of Oregon, 1913, and Chapter 222 Laws of 1915. These estimates are based upon current expenses of preceding years and the requisites of the term for which the estimates are made, with reductions or increase as deemed necessary in keeping with reasonable


