Ed Denton was over from Waitsburg Wednesday. Ed's shadow does not grow any less; he looks well and reports the little colony of former Weston people now located at that thriving little Washington city as in a prosperous condition.

While the city council was in session last Wednesday there was a false alarm of fire and the dispatch with which the city duds manned the hose cart and got to the street was pretty to see, if it was at the expense of dignity in those grave and reverend religions.

At a meeting of the city council Wednesday a tax of 5 mills was voted based on a city property valuation of \$95,000 as assessed for the year 1897. Councilman Williams submitted plans for the new city hall that has been in contemplation, and he is expected to submit specifications also before advertising for bids.

Last Saturday night the K. of P.'s large and well furnished hall was the scene of as good a number of people as ever assembled in Weston for a happy purpose. It was a social entertainment gotten up by Stevens Lodge, No. 49, K. of P., and there were about 90 persons present, consisting of the members of that order and invited guests.

Frank Henry is again in Weston, from La Grande, where he has been for some time past. Frank is going to revive the Weston school, which is good news, and an enterprise that should be encouraged by our citizens. The best band Weston ever had was under Frank's leadership, and as most of its members still reside here and will become members of the organization, it will not be long in regaining its former efficiency.

School district No. 9, the Dehaven district, will have a 3 mill tax this year. Such was the decision of a majority of the legal voters at a meeting held at the school house on Wednesday last.

Mary E. Koonis has commenced suit, in the superior court at Walls Walla, against William A. Koonis for divorce, on the grounds of desertion. She asks for the custody of their minor child.

The city council last Monday night levied a tax of 12 mills on the dollar on all real and personal property within the city limits. This will make the total of state, county and school 33 mills for taxpayers in Milton.

A Weston man wrote to the seed department at Washington for some tobacco seed. He told the secretary that he wanted Battle A. but his second choice was Climax, but if both of these were out to send him Star.

The little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Rolla Fellows was seriously injured while playing at school during one of the intermissions Wednesday. The little girl and a number of companions were sliding on a small patch of ice, when she tripped and fell, her companions falling on her. It is feared she is injured internally.

less, that a shareholder in a joint stock company need not be a free miner.

Every free miner shall during the continuance of his certificate have the right to enter, prospect or mine for gold and minerals upon any lands in the Yukon district, whether vested in the crown or otherwise, except upon government reservations or lands lawfully occupied.

A creek, gulch, river or hill claim shall not exceed 200 feet in length in the general direction of the stream or ravine on which it fronts and shall not be more than 1000 feet in width.

Every alternate 10 claims shall be reserved for the Government of Canada. That is to say, when a claim is located, the discovery claim and nine additional claims adjoining each other and numbered consecutively will be open for registration. Then the next ten claims of 250 feet each will be reserved for the government, and so on.

The penalty for trespassing upon a claim reserved for the crown shall be immediate cancellation of any entry or certificate which the persons trespassing may have obtained, whether by original entry or purchase for a mining claim, and the refusal of the acceptance of any applicant which the persons trespassing may at any time make for a claim. If any free miner or party of free miners discover a new claim, such discovery shall be established to the satisfaction of the mining recorder, creek, river or hill claims of the following size shall be allowed:

To one discoverer of claim, 500 feet in length, to a party of two discoverers, two claims, amounting together to 1000 feet in length; to each member of a party beyond two in number, a claim of the ordinary size only.

A claim shall be recorded with the mining recorder in whose district it is situated within 10 days after the location thereof. Entry shall not be granted for a claim which has not been stated by the applicants in person in the manner specified in these regulations. An entry fee of \$15 shall be charged the first year and an annual fee of \$15 for each of the following years.

A royalty of 10 per cent on the gold mined shall be levied and collected on the gross output of each claim. The sum of \$2500 shall be deducted from the gross annual output of a claim when estimating the amount upon which royalty is to be calculated, but this exemption shall not be allowed unless the royalty is paid at a banking office or to the gold commissioner or mining recorder.

The Penny-Giver to Church Collections Edward W. Bok makes an earnest plea, in the February Ladies' Home Journal, for a more liberal giving for church collections. It is an insult to God and His church, he contends, to surreptitiously drop a penny in the collection basket, when one can readily afford to give more. People, he says, take literally the teaching that religion is free, when—in fact, it costs money to have free religion. He suggests even clergymen announce from the pulpit that no pennies are wanted, and he shows how the money for church work could be greatly increased if those who now give pennies would make a nickel their minimum contribution. This, of course, does not include the very poor whose pennies is indeed the "widow's mite."
