We, your grand jury, duly aut regularly drawn and empan-lled on the first day of the present term of court beg leave to report as follows: We have examined 67 witnesses and have returned seven true bills of indictment and seven not true bills of indictment. We have visited the county poor house and find everything therein in good condition, the house cleanly kept, the inmates appear to be well treated. We find the kitchen and dining room too small for the present needs and would respectfully recommend that some provision be made to meet the demands of present needs and convenience. We also visited the county jail and find the same in good order and con

dition but would recommend that some new hammocks for the jail be provured. We have casually examined the city jail, from which examination we do not find it to be a bed of roses.


