

## MEADE NOMINATED

### REPUBLICANS OF WASHINGTON CHOOSE HIM FOR GOVERNOR.

#### Railroad Commission Resolution Voted Down Easily—Levi Ankeny Made Presidential Elector.

Tacoma, Wash., May 1.—The republican state convention was held in this city yesterday and was one of the most largely attended and enthusiastic political gatherings ever held in the state. The convention adjourned at 7:30. Governor McBride was turned down hard and his commission resolution was relegated to oblivion by a vote of 390 to 270. The nomination of A. E. Meade was a foregone conclusion. He is conceded to be a strong man and will easily be elected governor of the great state of Washington.

The ticket on the whole is most satisfactory to all. Many of the nominees were chosen by acclamation. After the convention many of the visiting politicians were banqueted and a general symposium was held.

Eugene Lorton, editor of the Walla Walla Union, was secretary of the convention.

#### New Method vs. the Old.

As a comparison in cost of harvesting with a Holt Combine and harvesting with the old header-thresher method, Mr. E. L. Smith, agent for the Holt Co., submits the following figures:

1000 acres at \$1.25 per acre.....\$1250  
Cost to thresh 1000 acres of 80 bu.  
grain at 6c.....1800  
Loss of 1 sack per acre on 1000  
acres at \$1.35 per sack.....1350

Total cost.....\$4400

To Buy Holt Harvester.....\$1800

20 head horses.....5000

10 set harness.....300

Cost of labor.....280

Total cost of outfit and help.....\$4380

The above figures show that a farmer can pay for entire outfit, pay cost of help and have \$21 to his credit. This is done in the harvesting of 1000 acres.

#### County Seat Contest.

Citizens of Union have filed a restraining order against County Clerk J. H. Minnaugh, forbidding him to place the names of Union and LaGrande on the official ballot for a vote on county seat removal. The courts will be called to pass upon the order immediately, as the ballots must be printed soon. The petitions presented to the county court by LaGrande asking for the removal are said to contain at least 1,500 fictitious names and names not on the registration book, hence the restraining order from the taxpayers.

#### Good Races.

The prospects for the spring race meeting of the Walla Walla County Fair association, May 25, 26, 27 and 28, are extremely flattering. Walla Walla is conceded by all horsemen to have the fastest track on the circuit, in fact, it is even better than last year when it turned out to be a marvel of speed. Already 200 horses have been entered for the 4 days' meet, and many of them are already in Walla Walla working out for the event.
