Every citizen of Oregon should get busy and advise his friends and acquaintances in other states that there are only four weeks left in which to get the advantage of the colonist rates to Oregon points. These tickets will be sold up to and including April 30th; there is lots of time to get in good work. To know Oregon better and particularly the community in which you live has become epidemic all over the State. No branch of the Oregon Development League is doing more effective work than the fruit growers' organization of Irrigon. They recently sent out five thousand pieces of matter in one delivery of the mail.

A leaden missile, sent crashing into a human body is a deplorable and regrettable act, even when performed by an officer in the discharge of his duty. On the other hand the dignity of the law, on which public safety relies and peace of the community depends must be upheld, even at the sacrifice of human life. For this reason, the law gives the peace officer the right to exercise his judgment in the use of firearms when necessary, in bringing law breakers under arrest.

Let the return of the goods be accepted in a spirit of thankfulness that a sense of justice is at last prevailing over the disposition of greed.
