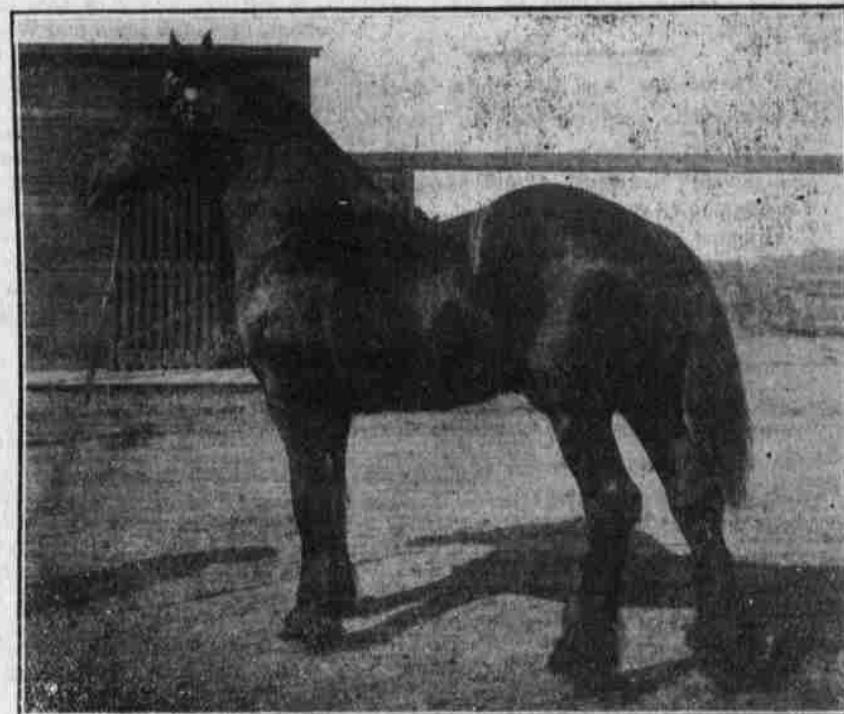

### Fruit Crop Good.

According to N. W. Mumford, manager of the Walla Walla Produce Co's packing house at Milton, fruit of all kinds is doing fine. Cherries are now on the market and coming in plentifully, the price being from 4 to 7 cents per pound, according to variety. May Dukes and Governor Wood are the greatest in demand at the present time. Peaches will be plentiful. Much pruning has been done on the trees in order that they will not be too heavy. Blackberries promise to be more plentiful than they have been for some years. Apples will be above the average, as the growers have taken more than ordinary precaution to spray the trees properly. The strawberry season is nearly over.
