

Wholesale Coal Dealers Accused of **Deliberately Keeping Down** 

**Production at Mines.** 

A Seattle paper contains the following:

Wholesale dealers are responsible for lack of fuel and increased prices in Seattle, by deliberately keeping down production and creating an artificial shortage, while there is enough coal under the ground close to the city to provide fuel, not only for the residents of Seattle, but for the fleets of the world when in action. This is the opinion of G. A. Redding, who has retired from the coal business, in which he was engaged for many years in Seattle.

"There is no justification," he said, "for an increase in the price of coal, except the desire of the operators to get as much as possible for their product. To do this they depend upon the urgent needs of the people and take advantage of desperate circumstances. Last winter it was impossible, a great part of the time, for the retail dealers to get coal, and the wholesale men, knowing that coal was sorely needed, kept as little on hand as possible, and then pretended that it could not be obtained.

"Coal has gone up in price within the last few weeks at the bunkers without the least reason in the world. It does not cost any more to mine now than it did formerly. The men do not get any increase in wages and the cost of bringing it to the city has not advanced. The fact is, all the coal lands in Washington belong to corporations that are interested in keeping them in poison too, biliousness, weakness and an undeveloped condition. THE BREAKING OF BREAD. Acts 2:42.

This was the third item of the program of public worship, observed each Lord's day by the Jerusalem Church, and has reference to the Lord's supper. First, we inquire into the meaning of this service. The one loaf represents the one body 1 Cor. 10:17. In figure the Church is called the body of Christ, Eph. 1:22, 23. When the Church was organized, it was a unit. Luke tells us that the Lord added to the Church, not Churches. So those who love these divisions in the Christian world and stand for them, cannot carry out this meaning of the Lord's supper.

It is a participation in the body and blood of Christ, 1 Cor. 10:16. In the Revised Version the marginal reading of this verse is "participation in," instead of "communion of the blood and body of Christ," giving the better meaning of the Greek. We see the force of this when we remember that Christ is our substitute, 1 Pet. 2:24, and thus becoming our life, because He died our death for us that we might live His life for Him. It is a remembrance of Him Lk. 22:

19. God so loved the world that He gave His Son that we might not perish. We are ever to keep that Gift in mind. The emblems of the Lord's supper represent the broken body and shed blood of Christ for us, thus redeeming us from the powers of Satan, death and the grave and He wants us to remember His dying love for us.

By it we proclaim the Lord's death and coming again, 1 Cor. 11:26. What a tremendous testimony this is for Jesus! The world does not want to believe that Jesus died for them but whenever a Christian partakes of the embiems of the Lord's supper he declares to the whole world that Jesus "died for all that they who live should no longer live unto themselves but unto Him who for their sakes died and rose again," 2 Cor. 5:15. Neither does the world believe He is coming again, see 2 Pet. 3:3, 4. But He is coming again, see John 14:2, 3; 1 Thes. 4:16-

Second, how often did they observe this service? Acts 2:42 gives us the program for public worship, and it is a part of that program. In Acts 20:7 we learn that they met upon the first day of the week for public service. The whole Christian world, in theory and practice, concede the primitive custom of assembling for worship on every Lord's day, and they rely on 20:7 for proof. But they mangle the pro gram of worship, placed by the Holy Spirit in the first Church, when they attended to the teachings of the apostles, the contribution and the prayers every Lord's day and leave out one item of that program-the Lord's supper-to be observed once a month or
