New York and Chicago Millionaires Give to Whitman College \$1,500,000.

Whitman College has been promised \$1,500,000 by New York and Chicago capitalists, according to ex-Governor Miles C. Moore, says the Bulletin. The college, which was founded by pioneer residents of the Walla Walla Valley, can have this amount providing \$500,000 can be raised on the Pacific coast, and an active campaign will be commenced in the near future to raise this amount in Washington, Oregon and Idaho.

"We have positive assurances of great financial support, amounting to at least \$1,500,000 for Whitman College, which will make it the model college of the North Pacific Coast, if we can raise \$500,000 in the Pacific Northwest," said Mr. Moore. "The whole matter has been considered by the Whitman College board and I have every reason for believing that the enterprise will be successful. There are several men in the Northwest who have been kindly treated by Dame Fortune in the past few years who will undoubtedly do their best to help raise the funds required here.

"If our plans bear fruit, Whitman College, which is now a non-sectarian institution, will be to the Pacific Northwest and the State of Washington what Leland Stanford University is to California and what Yale is to the east."

It is well known that certain Chicago men of vast wealth have liberally endowed Whitman College in the past, but it is also stated that the sources from which the money has come in the east are willing to subscribe \$1,500,000 for Whitman providing a liberal spirit is shown by men of means in the Pacific Northwest. While the sum mentioned, \$500,000, is expected to be subscribed by citizens of Oregon, Washington and Idaho, no definite amount has been agreed on.

A SOUL WINNING MINISTRY IN FOUR PARTS.

Part Fourth.

No man was ever known as a soul-winner who denied the plenary inspiration of the Bible. Every successful minister of Christ has unbounded faith in the Sacred Scriptures. And every one who would be successful must have the same faith. And when I say Sacred Scriptures I mean every thought from Genesis to Revelation. To begin to question the genuineness of any part is to open the way to a disposition to doubt and tear down the whole structure of truth. An old colored brother, a Deacon, said concerning his minister: "He's de bes man I eber seed to tak de Bible apart, but he dunno how to put it togedder agin." This is an excellent description of some ministers today. They criticize, change, explain away, set up their own opinions etc. until the message is one sided and without Divine authority. So much letting the Bible down to men, rather than lifting men up to the Bible has most seriously injured spiritual life in the churches until only about one in five or six of the membership are at prayer and class meetings and other devotional services.

We are in a time when great emphasis must be put on the person of Christ. To know who He is, is more important than to know what He said, for the authority of his Word depends upon who He is. And what is thought about Him is certainly going to affect what is thought about the efficiency of his atonement. Much modern day preaching only patronizes Christ and He is often damned with faint praise. The blood of sacrifice is lightly esteemed. His ethical teachings are exalted well but if souls are to be won the pulpit shall be the pedestal for the Cross. The only true preach-

ing is that of the Christ of God for Christ's dear sake. It is to them who preach the Divine and crucified Christ to whom the Holy Spirit is given for witnessing power, see 1st Cor 2. 1-5.

There is nothing that can be substituted with success in Gods sight for the fullness of his Holy Spirit. The engine may be a perfect piece of human mechanism as is possible with mighty wheels ponderous shafts and polished trimmings and ten thousand tons of water but without fire, she is only a dead pile of useless display, nice to behold, but powerless to turn a single wheel: And not only so, but must be removed out of the way to make room for another equipped with the power that only fire can produce. And so with the minister of Jesus Christ. He may possess all the brilliant trimmings that culture, society and education can produce and have every other qualification on earth, but without the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, and fire, his words will be as "sounding brass or tinkling symbol," see Acts 2. 2-4; Matt. 3, 11: Lu. 3, 16; Heb. 1, 7: 12, 29.

The Gospel of the crucified, risen ascended and glorified Christ was not allowed to be preached until after the endowment with Pentecostal power. Acts 1, 8. Christ was not acknowledged, by God, as his Son until the Spirit descended upon Him. Matt. 3, 16-17. Men may be teased, coaxed and persuaded to join a denomination without the Heavenly joy and peace of the precious Holy Spirit, but no one was ever won to Christ, in the real Gospel way, without it.

Right here is where many good meaning preachers, not only fail themselves, but hinder rather than help the cause. Some one has been moved by their eloquence, or persuaded by their arguments, to unite with the church, his real experience being taken for granted, when the real fact is he only reformed and was never born again at all, thus being deceived, for "Except a man be born again he cannot see the Kingdom of God," John 3, 3 and being so deceived is inclined to indifference and doubting and, in many cases is more difficult to search for real salvation than before he started at all, and often never finds the true secret of a happy life, while all this time his careless life has had an unwholesome influence on the community in which he has lived.

After all said, has been done, without a cultivation of the passion for souls, very few if any, will ever be won. This is the greatest of all human qualifications, and will be evident in his preaching. His earnestness, exhortation, pathos, power and personal appeal all, will show it, as well as warning and invitation. An old Scotch woman said of Robert McCheyne, "He preaches as if he is a-dyin a-most to have you converted." A colored minister was so burdened for the lost that he went, after midnight, and knelt at the doors of many unseparated and pleaded with God for their salvation. John Knox said "Give me Scotland or I die." George Whitefield said "Give me souls or take mine." William Burns, turned off from Argyle street, Glasgow, in order to weep alone for the unsaved masses going to and fro.

A man was in a desert where wild beasts and ugly things clutched at him and when he stood on the bluff overlooking the Sea where the breakers were beating on the white beach, there on the sand lay a body which he thought he recognized to be his own. And while the waves were coming nearer and nearer, he saw a white figure, a woman clothed in white, with something red in her hand and as she came near to rescue him he saw she bore in her hand her own (as it seemed) bleeding heart. What a picture of inspiration for us all to become winners of souls. Men are perishing, perishing, perishing! The threatening billows of destruction draw nearer and nearer to those dead in trespasses and in sins. O that we all might weep with Christ over the wicked city and seek to gather them in bleeding hearts to the perishing multitudes everywhere that they might be won, in perfect peace, to Him Who liveth and reigneth forever and ever!
