

ANOTHER ROAD PROJECTED

Report That Deal Has Been Closed for Line to Nez Perce.

A dispatch from Nez Perce says a report is again prominent here that Nez Perce is to get a railroad and activities in the way of real estate purchases and inquiries relative to the same the past few days are accredited to "inside" knowledge that plans have already been completed for supplying this section with transportation through a branch line that will leave the Caldwell-Grangeville road at a point near Ilo.

Whether the real estate deals are being made in connection with the purchase for grounds for depot and yard facilities or whether for speculation reports do not disclose. Well known Nez Perce men are interested in the deals and are directing same. The development is believed to be the outgrowth of a move made here two months ago, when steps were taken to organize a company to build the branch line. It was stated at that time that the Northern Pacific was back of the move. Now it is rumored at both the Northern Pacific and O. R. & N. are in the deal and that the branch will be built in connection with the general joint construction agreement under which the roads are working in this field. This report is to the effect that a branch will also be built to the Craig mountain section.

Following the news that the Kerr-Gifford company had purchased the Ketteneach grain company, report is in circulation here that Balfour-Guthrie, the big importing firm, is negotiating for the purchase of the Vollmer-Clearwater company's grain business in this field.

Go Prohis One Better.

Smarter under the criticism of its support of the local liquor traffic, and piqued because the city of Roseburg as well as the county as a whole went "dry" at the election, the City Council, at a meeting Friday night, ordered the enforcement at once of the state Sunday closing law in every one of its applications. The Council also ordered closed the only public house of ill-repute in the city.

SWEDES MIGRATE WESTWARD

An Army of One Thousand Are Coming Out to Idaho.

Driven to drastic action by lack of work, an army of a thousand Swedes are preparing to pull up stakes in Massachusetts and go to Idaho and establish a colony there, says a Lewiston Tribune dispatch. They are investigating a location near Lewiston and the present intention of their leaders is to settle there and till the soil.

Rev. C. A. Larsen of Gardner, Mass., is heading the movement. He is organizing his country people who are out of work on account of the low ebb of industry in this state, and is mapping out the course they will pursue. He said last night:

"This colonization movement has been brought about by the unsatisfactory conditions of the eastern labor market. Our people are harder hit than any other and something must be done. I have learned through a western friend of an excellent spot near Lewiston, Idaho, where good land can be secured at a reasonable price. Although many of our band are skilled workmen and can command good wages, they have taken up the idea of getting back to the soil and are glad to journey to the west. I cannot say definitely tonight whether we can make arrangements for a thousand homeseekers at Lewiston, but it is likely that will be the location of our colony."

Grant County Mines.

Two pounds of gold bullion, estimated to be worth \$384, was brought in from the Present Mine Saturday, says the Baker City Democrat. This with two tons of concentrates, represents the work for eight days with 13 shifts of two men each. Pierce & Son, the lessees of the mine, will begin to take out ore next Monday and continue on the ore. In about two weeks they will start the mill. Kirkpatrick & Elliott have leased the Equity mine for two years. They have just struck three feet of good ore. Frank Peoples started the Equity mill Monday on gold ore taken from the Delta mine owned by French Bros., of John Day. Mr. Lippincott, a prospector, was working above the Present Mine last week when he picked up a piece of float the size of an egg, which contained gold which is said to be worth 25 cents.—Prairie City Miner.

PUTS END TO JURY TAMPERING

Mrs. Dodson, Shrewdest Politician in Iowa, Wants Second Term.

Mrs. Frank W. Dodson, a widow, known throughout Iowa as the shrewdest politician in the entire state, is running for another term as county recorder of Polk county upon her record as a smasher of jury tampering. She put to rout a bold band of jury fixers in Des Moines and completely revolutionized the drawing of jurors throughout the state.

Where in former days the selection of jurors was a matter of choice it is now a matter of statute. And where the jury boxes in Des Moines were closed and tied together with a piece of wire they are now sealed. Mrs. Dodson does the sealing. She takes no chances.

Five years ago Mrs. Dodson was the wife of Attorney Frank Dodson, a candidate for district judge. To his wife Dodson confided his hopes and ambitions. He also confided to her the little ins and outs of politics until his wife had become thoroughly familiar with the methods of ward heeler and peanut politicians.

Her husband died suddenly and she was left with a little boy to support. Mrs. Dodson turned her attention to politics and ran for county recorder. The politicians fought her tooth and nail, but she went directly to the people and won out.

The Iowa statute at that time placed the drawing of jurors in the hands of the clerk, auditor and recorder, and Mrs. Dodson discovered that the drawing of jurors was a farce. She wondered why politicians always sat on juries and she discovered that it was due to the manner of drawing them.

She set to work to correct the abuse. She stirred up such a fuss as the state had never seen, and won out.

Leasing Wyoming Lands.

A special from Lander, Wyoming says of the oil excitement there: Sixteen men, individually and as representatives of companies, have leases on over 75,000 acres of oil land on the diminished portion of the Shoshone Indian reservation. The leases are granted by the government on application, providing the applicant is able to give \$10,000 bond for the good and faithful performance of his part of the contract. The lease covers asphalt, mineral, oil and gas, and the Indian receives a royalty of one-tenth of the output. The lessee is given two years to develop his property, which in each case is 4800 acres, and the lease runs so long as its conditions are carefully carried out.

Chester Thompson, acquitted last year of the murder of Judge George Emory on the ground of insanity, and sent to the insane ward of the penitentiary, was given his liberty, the jury last week having declared he had recovered his reason and was safe to be at large.
