

PURE MILK THEIR SLOGAN

Pendleton is Shaken By War on Diseased Herds.

Pendleton is being stirred from center to circumference by the agitation started recently for a purer milk supply. It was started almost inadvertently by City Physician Cole, who declared that a large percentage of the dairy cows which supply Pendleton with milk are infected with tuberculosis and that the disease is transmissible from the bovine to the human.

As a result of this statement and the agitation and crusade which is following in its wake the council will be asked to pass an ordinance providing for the inspection of all dairy herds, the tests to be made by the bureau of animal industry without expense to the city or the owners of cattle, and for the killing of all cows found to be infected.

The measure will also prescribe sanitary regulations, which the dairymen will observe. Among these will be a provision for the scalding of milk cans. It will also provide that milk bottles belonging to the dairies and used generally by the public shall not be left at homes where there are cases of infectious diseases. An inspection of stables and corrals will be ordered and the methods used in milking cows will be investigated.

MACHINE WARNING OF FROST

Kings Bell When Mercury Falls to Point Endangering Orchards.

Scientific fruit raising has been deliberately shoved into a new era by the recent installation of the automatic electric frost foreteller in the larger orchards of the Kennewick irrigated belt. New sets of agricultural and horticultural rules have been arranged by each farmer, who now sleeps the sleep of the righteous, though the mercury may drop to the zero mark during a cold spell, without the slightest fear that when he resumes daily duties the following morning he will find his crop blackened with frost.

The frost foreteller is an innocent looking piece of apparatus as it sits idly under the apple trees, but it has a little thermometer firmly planted amidstships that never goes to sleep. When the temperature starts a swift slide toward the freezing mark, several

degrees on the safe side thereof the trusty thermometer begins to ring that bell in the farmer's bed-room and keeps on ringing it until he comes out into the orchard and turns it off.

Scattered around here and there are covered pots. These pots are filled with crude petroleum, and once alarmed by the glass, the fruitgrower simply goes rapidly from pot to pot with a handful of matches, and it's all up with Jack Frost. In a moment the trees are enveloped in a thick, black smoke and the fruit crop is saved, the tops go back on the pots and the fires go out.

A fruit inspector says that orchards thus supplied with smudge pots can be kept eight degrees warmer than those without them, and many have been saved with them where smudge-potless ranches adjoining suffered total losses. Smudge pots are used in many places. Probably the Chinese invented them, but a new era dawned with the appearance of the thermo-electric indicator which unflinchingly gives the warning when to smudge.

Waitsburg Must Pay Tax.

Waitsburg citizens must pay the county road and bridge tax, according to a decision of the supreme court just rendered in the case of E. M. Denton against Walla Walla county, says the Waitsburg Times. This suit was brought to enjoin the county from enforcing the tax on the ground that the city charter, granted years ago by the legislature to Waitsburg, provided that no county tax for road or bridge purposes should ever be levied on property in the city.

Attorney Pruitt Disappears.

W. C. E. Pruitt, a Pendleton attorney and ex-newspaper man has disappeared and his continued absence has alarmed his friends. The last seen of the lawyer was when he boarded an O. R. & N. west-bound train, July 20. He told no one of his destination. His wife is at Lehman Springs. Pruitt had charge of the district attorney's office, and had been looking after the district attorney's duties during the vacation of Mr. Phelps.

Walla Walla Fair.

The Walla Walla County Fair Association has issued the premium list for the 1908 exhibition. The dates on which the fair will be held this year are October 12 to 17. In addition to liberal premiums offered for horticultural and agricultural exhibits, generous purses are offered in the speed program, the principal purse being \$2,000 for the 2:14 trot.

HEARST WILL PAY THE FREIGHT

Puts up Car Fare for His Independence League Delegates.

William Randolph Hearst, chairman of his national committee of his Independence league, knows how to promote harmony in the party and make the national convention work in well oiled grooves and syncopated time.

He pays the railroad fare and provides palatial Pullman cars for the state delegations going to and coming from the national convention to be held in Chicago.

At least that is what he has done for the Oregon delegation. Naturally all of the delegates are waiting for the time for the train to start, except M. J. Malley, of Portland, state chairman, who will be detained at home by press of private business and cannot get away long enough to take advantage of Mr. Hearst's hospitality.

A special car has been provided by the national central committee of the Independence league, the chairman of which is Mr. Hearst, and it will be in waiting for the Oregon and Washington delegations at the Portland depot when the train will leave for Salt Lake City.

At that place the Idaho and California delegations will join the Portland party and the consolidated delegations will proceed to Chicago in two special cars. The tickets which have been furnished by the national committee include a stopover privilege of 90 days. The delegates are expected to pay their personal expenses while going to and coming from Chicago.

The Washington delegation reached Portland Wednesday afternoon at 4 o'clock. At 5:15 they were joined by the Oregon delegation preparatory to taking the train. The Oregon delegates who will make the trip are as follows: Martin D. White, Neil O'Hare, Arthur C. Moffet, T. J. Byrnes, M. E. Gibson, W. R. Lake, P. McDonald and J. J. Fitzerald.
