

## FULTON'S MACHINE

Combination Effort to Down Chamberlain and Defeat Will of the People.

The old game is on again, says the Portland Journal. It is anything to beat George E. Chamberlain before the legislature for election to the United States senate. It is back to the old system of barter and sale, 40-day contests and debauchery, and this time the people are to be asked to aid in the revision. That is the plan that is now being mapped out by the Fulton faction, the old remnants of the Mitchell machine, for the subversion of the popular will and the reopening of the senatorial contest at Salem next January.

It is up in eastern Oregon, and through the sparsely settled districts, that the Fulton men expect to win their battle, defeat the people and elect Fulton to the senate if possible. And this is about the way they plan to do it:

Fulton men in eastern and central districts of the state are to circulate petitions for signatures among the voters of the districts directed to the representatives and senators from those districts asking them to disregard their Statement No. 1 pledge and vote for a Republican for senator. Fulton, of course, is to be the Republican.

At the same time pressure is to be brought to bear on these Statement No. 1 members of the legislature to influence them to agree to observe the request of these petitions, provided a majority of the voters of the district affix their names.

In the legislature there are 51 Statement No. 1 members, thus making it necessary to win over by some means, seven votes before the scheme of the Fulton faction can win. Even then, however, it would only be possible for Fulton to win provided he held the whole number of anti-Statement No. 1 men, and the seven subdivided votes, in line. The result, provided the seven men could be found to violate their pledges, would in all probability be a deadlock and no election.

According to the story now in circulation, Senator Fulton and his political advisers, have promised to fall in line behind the candidacy of Senator Jay Bowerman of Sherman, Gilliam and Wheeler counties for president of the senate provided Senator Bowerman and his friends throughout the interior districts "come through" with

the proposed petitions and pledges from the interior members to the legislature.

It is also the rumor that at least one member from the interior has said he would forget his Statement No. 1 pledge provided a petition signed by more than one half of the voters in his district, asking him to vote for a Republican, were presented to him before the date set for the election of United States senator.

The Fulton following expects by this petition scheme to be able to switch at least seven members of the legislature. They contend that the people who voted for Statement No. 1 members of the legislature did not take into account the possibility of Governor Chamberlain winning the popular in-dorsement. They argue that the majority want a Republican and are willing to abandon their belief in the principle of the direct election of United States senators to secure a Republican.

In the face of this argument and effort, however, comes the vote which the people of Oregon gave to the bill, now a law, instructing the members of the legislature to vote for the candidate for United States senator who received the popular vote. In June last this law was passed by a popular vote of 69,668 for and 21,163 against the measure, or by a majority of 48,506 votes. At the same time George E. Chamberlain received 52,421 votes. Thus it is seen that 17,247 voters of the state who did not vote for Chamberlain did vote for the principle set out in the law, placing themselves on record as favoring the obedience of the legislature to the popular will of the people as expressed at the polls.

Senator Fulton and his friends, in the senatorial campaign, are going on the theory that the 69,668 voters of the state who cast their ballots in favor of a law to make the popular vote binding on the legislature, as regards the United States senatorship, did not mean what they expressed by their votes last June. The plan is to make loyalty to party the great plea in the hope that, aided by the enthusiasm of the presidential campaign, a majority of the voters can be induced to repudiate their belief in the direct election of United States senators, in order to defeat Governor Chamberlain and elect Senator Fulton to the office already accorded to him by the popular vote of the people.

## NO LIQUOR AT SPOKANE FAIR

The Barroom Will Be Used for the Poultry Show Exhibition.

Nothing but temperance drinks will be sold on the Spokane fair grounds this year, as the sale of liquor is a thing of the past at the fair. There will be no bar on the Spokane fair grounds this fall. This was the unanimous opinion of the board of directors at the last meeting of the Interstate Fair association.

The abolition of the bar was deemed necessary, so the liquor selling concession will be omitted from the list of privileges to be auctioned to the highest bidder on the 29th of August. The long bar under the grandstand will be devoted henceforth to other purposes.

"The management of the fair has long desired to take this step, and has taken it on their own volition, believing it to be the wish of the people," states President George T. Crane. "We have always tried to conduct the fair to please the public. We have had the matter under discussion since the fair last fall, and it has been practically understood that the bar privilege in the future would be suspended. Conditions have changed and I want to assure the public that we are trying always to manage the fair to please the greater number."

The former barroom under the big grandstand will, in all probability, be turned into a poultry show this year. This poultry exhibit this fall will be one of the most extensive in the history of the fair.

## STILL HUNTING FOR LOST BOY

Paroled Convict Duping Parents of Boy Lost at Toll Gate.

A special from Lewiston, Idaho, to the Oregonian says: Cecil A. Brittan, the Walla Walla boy, 7 years old, kidnapped at Tollgate in the summer of 1908, is either secreted in the Grand Ronde district or the parents are the victims of a plot to extort money, because of their anxiety to recover the missing boy.

The hunt for young Brittan was directed to the Grand Ronde section by Sam Breen, a paroled convict from the Walla Walla penitentiary, who is alleged to have confessed to complicity in kidnapping the child, and who was placed on parole to assist the parents in their search.

Breen visited Lewiston last week and rode into Grand Ronde section. He returned Saturday night and was met by R. L. Brittan and wife, parents of the child. Breen said he had met the parties with the boy and that a horse was shot from under him when he attempted to carry the child away.

L. M. Butler of Spokane is said to be associated with Breen in the search. The entire party left for the point in Eastern Oregon where Breen said the captors had headed for after the encounter in the Grand Ronde section.

Little credence is given to the story of the shooting and it is generally believed that the Brittan family has been victimized.

Big Irrigation Project.  
The biggest irrigation enterprise, costing \$15,000,000, ever undertaken in this country, was launched Tuesday when the Idaho state land board segregated, under the Carey act, 400,000 acres in Owyhee county, Idaho. The project is financed by the Buhl interests, giving the first demonstration of the great possibilities of irrigation under this act. The waters of the Snake and Bruneau rivers will be diverted to the land under the project. This is the sixth and greatest of the Twin Falls projects, making a total area under them of 1,000,000 acres.
