JUDGES DESIRE BETTER FRUIT

Complain That Diseased Fruit Is Pre-dominant in Exhibits.

The ladies who were appointed judges of the fruit display at the Third District fair in Pendleton last week complained bitterly that the exhibitors themselves, especially in apples and pears had not taken better care in selecting their exhibits. Only one perfect apple display was found among all the individual showings and the rest together with all the pears were affected with worms, scale, or bitter rot. The peaches and grapes were generally pretty clean fruit.

They recommended that no premiums be given on any imperfect fruit next year. Another recommendation will be that the individual displays entered be placed in one location instead of distributed among all the booths as the custom this year.

One feature of the task that showed a negligence upon the part of the exhibitors was the naming of many exhibits. Some fruit exhibited under wrong names would have taken first prizes had they been properly entered, but were under the circumstances thrown out.

The objections raised by the judges are based upon a desire for more judicious and earnest work in bringing the fruit standards of Umatilla and Morrow counties up to the highest rank.

FIRST MAN TRIED CONVICTED

Moffat Pays \$1000 [for Privilege of Selling 75 Cents Worth of Booze.]

The first decisive victory in the fight for the enforcement of the local option law made by District Attorney Phelps was won Wednesday afternoon when after a deliberation of about one hour the jury in the case of the State against Ben Morton, brought in a verdict of guilty as charged.

Morton was proprietor of the old Brewery saloon in Pendleton and was one of the first against whom indictments were returned. Eight true bills were returned against him by the grand jury and of this number seven indictments are yet to be disposed of. The man was defended by Will M. Peterson and Col. J. H. Raley, while District Attorney Phelps personally conducted the prosecution.

The fight of the defense in the address to the jury was made largely upon the fact that the witnesses against Morton were detectives.

It cost Tom Moffat \$1000 because he sold six tins worth of liquor in Pendleton contrary to the local option law.

Moffat and two bartenders, Van Goodwin and John Doe Wednesday morning appeared before Judge Bean in the circuit court and received sentence upon six counts to which they had pleaded guilty. The fines, amounting to \$1000 were paid in cash by the saloon man. No jail sentence was passed upon the men.

The owner, Moffat, who runs the old Joe Sullivan place, was fined \$300 for his first offense, and \$400 for the second count. Goodwin and Doe each received a fine of \$50 for their first offense and were assessed \$100 for breaking the law the second time.
