

NATIONAL EXHIBIT

Interest Stimulated in All Sections in Great Apple Show to Be Held in Spokane.

Favorable action on the part of the federal government at Washington, D. C. as well as by the railroads of the country has stimulated interest in all sections in the national apple show to be held in Spokane in December this year. With the opening of the show, still over a month away, exhibits have begun to arrive in such numbers that it has been necessary for the management to arrange for free cold storage accommodations to handle the fruit. Exhibits from states as far east as New York have begun to come in, although it is not expected that the bulk of the entries will arrive until shortly before the show opens in December.

The cooperation which the government promised will come in the form of judges from the department of agriculture at Washington, D. C. Manager H. J. Neely asked Secretary Wilson that judges be sent from the department of agriculture so that no favoritism be shown in awarding the prizes.

The railroads have granted reduced rates from all points amounting to less than a fare and a third for the round trip, with first class tickets. It is likely that they will reduce freight and express rates on apples sent for exhibit, this matter now being under consideration.

Oklahoma, Colorado, Missouri and North Carolina are among the states which are preparing state exhibits aside from the individual entries from each of them. Several apple sections in British Columbia have appointed agents to prepare exhibits which will be sent to Spokane. Lewiston, Idaho, also has appointed an agent and has issued a letter of instructions to every apple grower in the district in an effort to get a prize winning exhibit.

Negotiations for a building additional to the state armory were closed last week when a contract was entered with the ministerial association of this city for the use of the big tabernacle to be used by "Billy Sunday" for his evangelistic meetings following the national apple show. The armory and tabernacle together will have floor space of 60,000 square feet, and will accommodate 20,000 people. It is estimated that there will be 50,000 square feet of apple on display in these two buildings, this being the biggest exhibition of the kind of fruit ever made anywhere.

The educational features of the national apple show are practically worked out, and include lectures by several noted pomologists as well as demonstrations on every phase of the apple industry. Every device used in the handling of the fruit will be on exhibition and in charge of experts. Spray pumps, box presses, parers, cookers and other such inventions now in use by successful orchardists will be demonstrated for the educational side of the exposition has from the first been looked upon as of chief importance.

THE ANNUAL CLASS SCRAP

Whitman Freshmen and Sophomores to Compete for Honors.

A great change has been made during the present year in the method of conducting the annual class "scrap" between the freshman and sophomore classes at Whitman. Heretofore the class "scrap" has been allowed to take its own course. It has dragged along all through the college year, not only making it disagreeable for the members of the two lower classes but for the rest of the institution as well.

According to the plan which has been submitted to the two classes for consideration, by a member of the faculty, the class "scrap" will hereafter come off on an appointed day, which day shall have been well advertised in advance. The days program shall be entirely under the supervision of the upper-classmen of the college who will carry out the program, act as judges of all contests and declare the winners.

It is planned to have the program consist of athletic events such as foot racing, weight throwing, jumping, stump speaking, and finally as the last event of the day will come a mammoth canoe race, in which the members of the two classes will compete.

The idea as suggested has been given over to the classes, and each class has appointed a committee of several members to make a definite report as to the attitude which the class should take. Both committees agreed to try the plan. Each class shall have the privilege of appointing a committee of five members. These two committees will then get together and arrange the program, but after the program has been established and submitted to the two classes for approval, it shall be turned over to the upper classmen who will superintend its fulfillment.
