

# ELLIS ON THE TARIFF

Favors Change Where Tariff Affects Trust-Made Articles Which Sell at Exorbitant Prices.

Umatilla county farmers may profit by a reduction of the tariff on harvesting machines if it is proven upon investigation that they are among the trust made articles which through monopoly and tariff are sold at exorbitant prices, according to Judge Ellis, who declared to the East Oregonian that he favors tariff revision at the coming session of congress.

"The tariff," said Judge Ellis, "should be revised without favor to any special interest and along such lines as will least disturb the legitimate business of the country and the earnings of the workers."

"I favor standing by the promise of the republican platform for revision. Just what articles upon the schedules should be lowered, I am not prepared to state, for I have not had the opportunity to give the matter thorough investigation."

"I believe congress should revise the tariff upon trust made articles wherever it enables the trust through lack of competition to overcharge the American consumer for its wares."

"I do not know whether the harvesters are among such products, as charged by the democrats in the last campaign, or not, but I favor an investigation and should it prove so I would like to see the trouble justly remedied."

"I favor legitimate profits to the manufacturer and good wages to the workers, and a tariff to protect the country's interests in both, but where the tariff allows exorbitant prices it should be readjusted."

Judge Ellis was asked if there should be a change in the tariff on wool.

"Each locality has its favorite industry," was the response, "and it is to a great extent a question of give and take. I believe the facts in connection with all these industries should be given to congress and such action taken as will be for the best interests of the whole country, even though to gain this end local interests must suffer slightly."

## BIG POWER PLANT AT DAYTON

Farmers' Railroad May Secure Tukanon River Rights.

With the possibility of the construction of a railroad from Dayton to Walla Walla and on to Wallula to connect with boats on the Columbia river comes the possibility of an immense electric plant on the Tukanon river some 15 miles above Dayton. An immense water power was secured by

the old railway company at the point on the Tukanon where the fall is greatest, and this right, it is understood, will be turned over to the new company.

Engineers who estimated the cost of a plant two years ago held that power can be secured cheaper there than at most any other point in the northwest and business interests of Dayton will encourage any move that will lead to the development of a large plant within reach of that point. It is understood that the plan of building a steam road and afterward electrifying it is meeting with opposition on account of the high cost of making the transfer and loss in way of equipment.

Dayton is primarily interested in an interurban electric line and will give every encouragement to such a road. There are two steam lines paralleling each other for 10 miles down the Touchet valley now, and another line of the same sort would not give the service needed. But farmers along the line have offered to give freely of and for right of way and labor in grading, and the business men of the town will support the proposed plan heartily in hope of securing an electric line by the time it is in shape to be operated by steam.
