

SCALP THE INDIANS

Skinned, Skunned, and Trowned By
Athena's Clever Shamrocks—At
the Mercy of La Brasche.

It has been many a day since the Pendleton Indians received such a downright, heartless scalping at the hands of Athena ball players, and you will have to go back to the days of the Yellow Kids, when they used to make a monkey of Bob Brown, now manager of the Spokane League team to find anything to equal Sunday's slaughter. And it was all done in seven innings, too.

Oh my gee, but it was sweet to see the Athena bunch play around the Pendleton contingent, and the score 9 to 1, repaid the crowd for its long wait on the late train.

La Brasche, who was on the mound for the Shamrocks, had everything to offer, and the warm weather called on the sturdy youngster to give 'em all he had, and he did it so smooth and machine like that he had the Indian sluggers nibbling at all sorts of wide shots, quick breaks and sizzing pan-splitters. The Pendleton tatters were completely at his mercy at every stage

of the game, and their only run came in the fifth when the first injin up sent a sizzler at La Brasche, which caromed off his finger tips, took third on a passed ball and scored on Niles' overthrow to Strauss.

The rest of it was all Athena. Strauss did some clever base running and played first a la Cartano. Niles at short did some clever work and "Happy" was there with the goods behind the bat. The warm weather brought the kinks out of the boys and they all played with ginger.

Dickenson for Pendleton got off bad in the first inning and never recovered himself. Strauss smashed the first ball for a single, stole 2nd and 3rd and scored on Happy's single. In the third after La Brasche and Niles had been retired Strauss drew a 2-bagger, went to third on an overthrow and brought in the second run when Happy stung the ball for a double which he tried to stretch into a 3-bagger by cutting second base.

It was ducks for the Shamrocks in the fifth and sixth. La Brasche fanned. Niles biffed a long fly square into the hands of the left gardener, who muffed it. The little shotstop plunged on to second, the ball reaching the baseman at the same time but was knocked from his hands by Niles who slid in. He stole 3rd and scored on Happy's sacrifice. Strauss was safe on Strand's slow throw, stole 2nd and

3rd and scored on Happy's sacrifice. With two down, Liesallen was safe at 1st on a batted ball, but went to sleep and was caught napping. In the sixth Willaby smashed out a single, stole 2nd, went to 3rd on R. Niles' sacrifice, and scored on Strauss' bit. Depeatt was passed, executed a double steal with Stone, and both scored when La Brasche stung out a long single. La Brasche scored on Niles' and a series of wild tosses by the Pendleton aggregation. Strauss sent the ball into left which was again muffed by the gardener and scored from second when Happy singled. The score:
