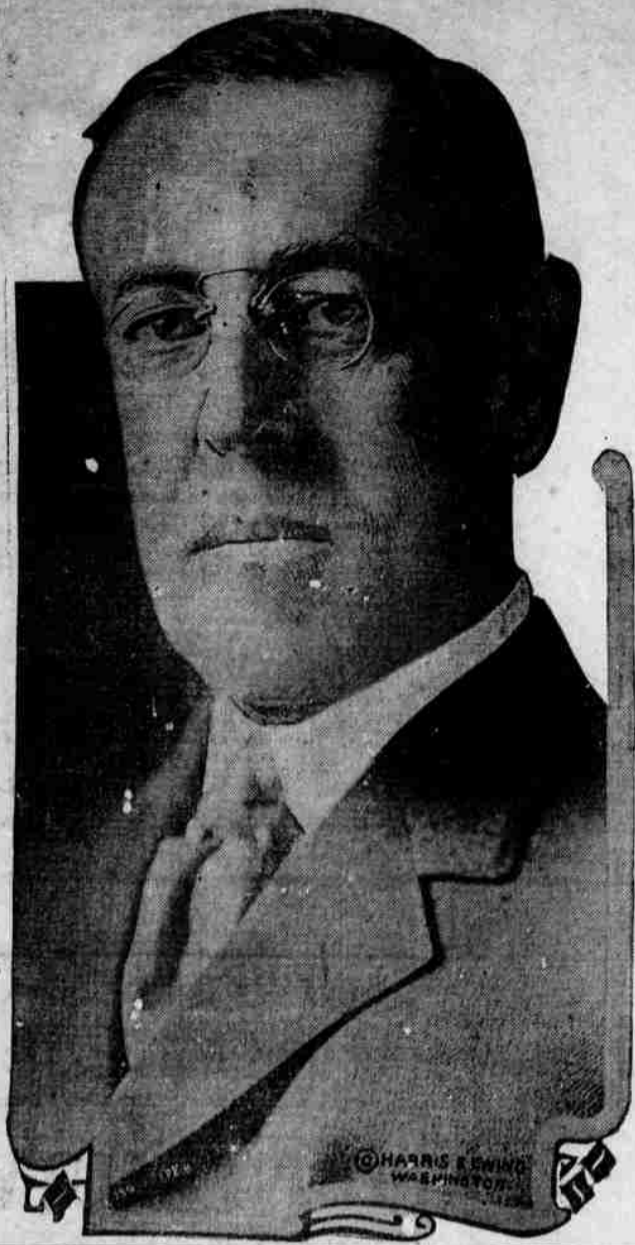


LATEST PHOTOGRAPH OF PRESIDENT WILSON



WILSON RE-ELECTED

Woodrow Wilson was re-elected to the presidency Tuesday, after one of the closest contests ever made. He has the distinction of winning after his opponent carried the pivotal Eastern states. California decided the contest when that state was ushered into the democratic column yesterday afternoon, Oregon went for Mr. Hughes by a small majority.

ATHENA ELECTION RESULTS.

Athena polled a big vote Tuesday. The day was fair and voting began early in the forenoon after the polls in the three precincts were opened. Interest centered in the national contest and Wilson overwhelmingly defeated Hughes. The democratic ticket carried in Athena for county offices, with four exceptions. The returns follow:

Above picture is an exact duplicate of the house for Mr. and Mrs. D. H. Sanders now being built on South 3rd street. This illustrates pretty well the service the Tum-A-Lum people are giving to builders around Athena and other points where they are situated.

The new home will have a large living room with fireplace and seats, dining room opening from living room by means of a pedestal arch in which will be placed china closets opening into dining room. The ceilings of the living room will be laid off in panels and the dining room will be wainscoted up to plate rail with America's most beautiful wood, Douglas fir, especially selected for grain. A buffet will set in the wall between the kitchen and dining room and directly behind the buffet will be built a commodious kitchen cupboard which will have space for dishes. Above and below will be drawers, bins, and moulding board connecting by means of a work table to the sink, under which will be built doors for pots and pans closets. A wood hoist and dumb waiter make up the rest of this excellent arrangement and the whole arrangement will undoubtedly save many steps in house work.

Entrance to first floor will be had through a reception hall from which a beautifully designed stairs leads to second floor with a built-in ball seat. A den is opposite the living room with large bay window and between this and bedroom on first floor is located bath with usual plumbing fixtures, clothes chute to basement, and medicine cabinet with mirror door.

Mr. and Mrs. Sanders on second floor will have three bedrooms with closets and large sleeping porch together with a sewing room. A rear screened porch off the kitchen is provided and a full basement will be finished off with fuel room, fruit room and laundry tray.

A square scheme of inside trim has been adopted for the finish of the interior, as this is a very logical and up-to-date finish, being at the same time easy to keep clean and very well looking as well as economical.

D. Scott Fisher has the general contract and the Tum-A-Lum Lumber Co. will furnish building material. H. E. Crawford, architect for the Tum-A-Lum Co., who furnished the plans and specifications, states that they are planning many new homes for their customers this fall and that most of them come from suggestions to be found in their new Free Plan Book. The new home will be a welcome addition to Athena's list of modern homes.
