

CARROTS USEFUL FOR STOCK

Use of Crop Made by Feeding to Cattle-Good Results Secured in Feeding to Horses.

Dairy cattle can make better use of arrots than any other class of farm ive stock, although they can be fed o the horses with good results. It might also pay to feed limited quantitles of them to the hogs, while they are an excellent feed for all classes of sheep. Unless the cows are receiving silnge they will make good use of 10 or 15 pounds of these roots daily and if receiving silage the addition of four or five pounds of carrots to the ration will be beneficial. Two or three imes a week the horses may be given a few pounds each of the sliced roots. They are relished greatly by these animals and in finited quantities have a good effect on the bowels. Like mos roots and tubers, carrots are too bulky to make an especially good feed for ogs, but a few added to the ration from time to time if the animals prove

to like them, will add to its palatability. Suckling ewes and growing lambs can be given an amount of carrots equaling the grain ration with good esults. Given under proper condition to the various classes of farm live stock, carrots provide a valuable though usually a rather expensive source of feed.

POULTRY WANT WATER FIRST

During Winter, First Thing Fowl Does on Leaving Roost is to Make

In winter, as in summer, the first thing a fowl does when it leaves the roost is to hunt the water pan, and nearly the last thing before going on the roost is to drink. If the water be icy cold they will cut the drinking short, but if warm they will drink plenty. If the weather be freezing, several times a day I go around with the boiling tea kettle warming up the water. About three in the afternoon as I have for years noticed, the laying hens hunt the shell or lime supply At any time in the day they pick at charcoal. They will try to break this up themselves, but will ent more of it if you keep it hammered into tiny bits.
