**Mercury Destroys Fungus**  
Mercury, which in one form or another is a specific for various human ills, is the last word in fungicides for nursery stock. Treatment with organic compounds of mercury during the operation of grafting apple nursery trees has been found by Department of Agriculture experts to reduce materially subsequent infection of the stock with crown gall. Formaldehyde has been used in the past for this purpose, but the more recently developed mercury compounds have proved much more efficacious in checking the spread of the fungus growth.
