

Nicaragua Behind Times Nicaragua is a Spanish-speaking republic, the population of which is about 650,000. The people are principally of mixed Spanish and Indian race. Agriculture, lumbering and mining are the principal sources of the national wealth. There is very little manufacturing. The climate is largely tropical, and the principal agricultural products are bananas, coffee and sugar cane, besides some grains for home consumption. The forests contain mahogany, cedar and dye woods, which are largely exported to the United States. Nicaragua is to a considerable extent mountainous, and there are some gold mines, worked by American or British companies.


