#### D'Autremonts Begin Serving Life Sentences

Prison gates closed on the three De Autremont brothers Friday as they began serving life sentences for four murders committed in the Siskiyou mountains train holdup of October 1923.

While they were being put through penitentiary routine and given their prison garb they were being hanged in effigy in Ashland, not far from the scene of the crime which each of the brothers had confessed.

Popular feeling at Ashland, the home of Charles O. Johnson, the Southern Pacific brakeman, one of the four men killed in the holdup, stirred several hundred citizens to participate in a hanging bee, in which dummies labeled Ray, Roy and Hugh were strung up. Ashland folk were indignant because the brothers escaped the extreme penalty of the law.

On their way to the prison from the train the brothers consented to be photographed. Ray interposed on condition that one of the pictures be sent to his wife, Hazel De Autremont, at Hanging Rock, Ohio.

#### Automobile Turns Over Two Musicians Hurt

Two members of Richmond's Arcadians were cut about the head and arms and four others were bruised and shaken up when the sedan in which they were returning to Walla Walla from a dance at Prescott, where they played, left the road on a curve on the Dry Creek hill and turned over, coming to a halt by a telegraph pole, at 12:30 Saturday morning. The two musicians, whose names were not learned, were rushed to St. Mary's hospital and given treatment.

A trailer attached to the sedan was said to have skidded and caused the sedan to turn over. New uniforms of the musicians were torn and splattered with blood. The sedan was badly damaged and all occupants were said to have had a miraculous escape from death or serious injury.

#### Lindbergh to Make United States Air Tour

Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh will make an airplane tour of the United States, the Daniel Guggenheim fund for the promotion of aeronautics, under whose auspices the tour will be made, announced tonight.

Colonel Lindbergh will fly "The Spirit of St. Louis," in which he made the New York to Paris flight. He will start in about three weeks and cover the entire country.

It is expected that the nationwide flight will take two or three months, during which Colonel Lindbergh will visit most of the principal cities in the United States. The entire undertaking will be financed by the Daniel Guggenheim fund for the promotion of aeronautics.

#### Leavenworth, Wash., Rioting Fatal

Leavenworth, Wash.—One man is dead, another in the hospital with two bullet wounds, and four are in jail as the result of an encounter at 2 o'clock Sunday morning between Constable Tescher and a gang of laborers. According to the story told Sheriff Wheeler by Constable Tescher, a gang of seven men, those named and one other, were rioting drunkenly in front of a cafe when Tescher ordered them to move on. Instead of obeying, they assaulted the officer. Residents there summoned Sheriff Wheeler from Weatchee, who rounded up six of the gang, the seventh escaping.

#### St. Denis

St. Denis, the patron saint of France, especially during the centuries of the old monarchy, is known in history as Dionysius, the first bishop of Paris. In the year 270 he and his companions suffered martyrdom. The bishop's body was buried at a spot about five miles north of Paris. Somewhat later a chapel was built over the grave and it was a place for pilgrimages during the Fifth and Sixth centuries. In the year 630 King Dagobert built an abbey there, and later buildings of like kind still stand there. One is occupied by a school for daughters of members of the Legion of Honor, founded by Napoleon I. A town grew up about the spot, known then as now as St. Denis. Once it was held to be the military key of Paris. Today it is an industrial place with a population of 65,000.
