

St. Depls, the patron saint of France, especially during the cen turies of the old monarchy, is known in history as Dionyslus, the first bishop of Paris. In the year 270 he and his companions suffered martyrdom. The bishop's bedy was buried at a spot about five miles north of Paris Somewhat later a chapel was built over the grave and it was a place for pilgrimages during the Fifth and Sixth centuries. In the year 630 King Da gobert built an abbey there, and later buildings of like kind still stand there. Once it was held to be the military key of Paris. Today it is an industrial place with a population of 65,000.
