CANADIAN FARMER FAVORED

The United States shipping board, finding that inland rates on export traffic are more favorable in Canada than in the United States, urges that bottles. some remedy be found to overcome the American disadvantage.

That appears to be an allusion to a condition that has called out a protest from American grain growers. Freight rates on Canadian grain time." for export, both eastbound and westbound, are approximately one-half those charged by the American railroads.

Since the freight rate on exported grain fixes the price on all the grain etc. grown, that Canadian advantage puts the American grain growers at a disadvantage and is a handicap to development in the western United States.

W. W. Harrah, prominent Umatilla county farmer, at the wheat conference recently held at Arlington presented a compilation of wheat shipping rates as paid by the American farmers and the Canadian farmers.

A great advantage is given Canadian wheat growers over the grower this side of the line. By way of illustration, the rate from Pendleton to Portland, 222 miles, as 11.1 cents per bushel; St. Louis to New Orleans, 697 miles, 10.8 cents per bushel. Arlington to Portland, 140 miles, 9.9 cents per bushel; Minneapolis to Duluth, 149 miles, 3.9 cents per bushel.

Here is shown a marked discrepancy in rates affecting the west in favor of the mid-west and the south-eastern section of the United States, but a further discrepancy favors the Canadian farmer over all. For instance, from Regina to Port Arthur the distance is 780 miles and the rate is only 7.2 cents per bushel; from Calgary to Vancouver, 996 miles and the rate for that distance is but 12.6 cents per bushel.

Wrong Idea About Birds The habits of some Porto Rican birds give rise to rather curious bellefs among the natives, writes Doctor Wetmore of the Smithsonian Institution.
