Students Win High Honors at U. of O.

University of Oregon, Eugene — What is considered to be the highest honor a college student can receive was conferred on five women and one man when Phi Beta Kappa, national scholastic honorary for men and women, elected them to membership. These six students, known as the "senior six," stand highest in grade averages among the senior class.

Those elected were Mary Klemm, Mrs. Jeanette Edge and Katherine Karpenstein; Naomi Hohman, La Wanda Fenlason, and Karl Landstrom. Members of the scholastic society are selected for scholarship, general character and ability. A Phi Beta Kappa committee conducted an investigation for some time into the records of the candidates before they were elected to membership.

Frenchman's Clever Trick

Infant Identification

Babies must be measured, weighed, their finger prints taken, and any birth marks noted on an official form, for which the doctor and nurse are responsible, as well as for the legal registration of the babies. Further, the parents of the child must sign the document, so as to avoid any mistake.

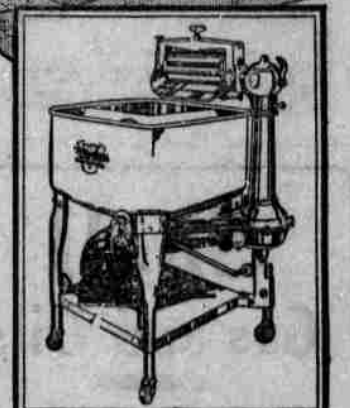
