Noted Musician Now at Head of Piano Study

University of Oregon, Eugene -George Hopkins, outstanding young American planist and composer, has been named head of the plano department of the University of Oregon school of music, it is announced by Dean John J. Landsbury.

Mrs. Jane Thacher, who is still a nember of the faculty of the school of music, resigned last June as head of the department in order to devote more time to her students and to concert work.

The newly chosen music executive. who has been a member of the faculty of the university since 1919, has been hailed by many critics as one of the most promising of the younger artists. He has appeared in concert throughout Oregon and the Northwest and in eastern states as well. His compositions have been highly praised by such musicians as Ignaz Friedman. Mr. Hopkins' "Valse Burlesque" was first performed by Mischa Levitzki. Other compositions which have been played by leading artists include his "Three Dances in Classic Form," the "Romance Pathetique," and "Scherzo in E Minor."

Mr. Hopkins has his teacher's certificate from the Peabody conservatory, and his B. A. degree from the University of Oregon.
