

All Oregon Week.

The Benson celebration Tuesday of this week ended a week of festivity at the Oregon building at the exposition. Monday, August 9, was 'All Oregon Day' with rousing speeches by a number of distinguished Oregonians, who boosted the good old state in a way that caused the natives there to sit up and take notice. Hundreds of Oregonians and former Oregonians were there to do honor to the occasion. The program for the rest of the week included Rogue River Day, Tuesday. The Southern Pacific had worked up special interest in this day and more than a score went down from Medford, Ashland and way points to be in attendance. Wednesday was given over to Eastern Oregon and the plan included the giving away of 10,000 sacks of popcorn. Thursday belonged to Coos Bay, Friday to Tillamook and Saturday to the Willamette Valley.

State Industrial News.

Wapato lake has a hundred acres of flax crop coming on. Yamhill county has oiled fifty miles of main highway for \$1500. Medford is promised a \$600,000 sugar beet factory in time for the crop of 1916. The last legislature enacted 53 game laws—great industry this legislating. A site has been selected at Albany for a paper mill plant to cost a million and a half dollars. Portland is moving for a city manager in place of its you-tickle-me-and-I'll-tickle-you commission.
