**THE FRENCH IN THE BALKANS**

London.—At the French headquarters in the Balkans it was announced Monday that Bulgarian and Serbian troops had crossed the Greek border at Pograd, Kozlevo and Spalovo, and were advancing toward Debarra toward Kavala. The information was received here in a dispatch from Athens to the Associated-Press company.

The Greek forts Sigal and Dragotin are, respectively, 12 and nine miles south of the town of Demir-Hissar, while Spalovo fort lies four miles east of that town. Kavala, on which the Bulgarians are said to be marching, is a resort on the Aegean Sea, 95 miles in an air line southeast of Demir-Hissar.

After crossing the Aegean Sea without loss, the Serbian army in full strength has been landed at Saloniki, according to a dispatch.

Serbia's new army has been variously estimated numbering between 80,000 and 100,000 officers and men. It

Patton and his men left the camp in their three autos and fought the bandits from the autos, that is to say, they sprang directly from their cars into the fight, putting the encounter in a class by itself.

was reorganized on the island of Corfu, which is approximately 700 miles distant by water from Saloniki.

The Serbian army totaled about 800,000 at the outbreak of the war, but this force was greatly depleted as a result of an epidemic of typhus and bitter engagements fought in an endeavor to check the Austro-German and Bulgarian invasion of Serbia and Montenegro. The remnant of the original army saved itself by retreating through the Albanian mountains.

On reaching the coast, the Serbians were transported to the island of Corfu, off the southern coast of Albania, where they were supplied with new rifles and clothing and efficiently equipped for further service on the Balkan battlefield.

**German Pierce French Lines.**

Berlin.—French infantry attacks on the German positions on the southwest slope of Dead Man's Hill and on the newly captured village of Oumlers, northwest of Verdun, were repulsed Sunday with heavy losses to the attackers, says the official statement at German army headquarters.

The statement adds that German reconnoitering detachments penetrated the lines of the entente allies at several points during the night, capturing about 100 prisoners in the Champagne district.

**Villa Pursuit Doubted.**

Columbus, N. M.—Little credence is placed by military authorities here in reports from Chihuahua that Carranza troops have discovered Villa in hiding near Jimenez. Several officers have expressed their conviction that Villa is still alive, but asserted that General Pershing, expeditionary commander, is in possession of information as to the probable whereabouts of the bandit chieftain, which does not coincide with that of General Trevian.

Olympia, Wash.—For the whole state of Washington this year's fruit crop is from one week to two weeks later than normal, according to Assistant State Commissioner of Agriculture Morrison. Soft fruits were materially damaged by the hard frost of May 10, 11 and 12. The cold weather of last winter did more damage than the frosts of spring, however. Light cherry, raspberry, blackberry and loganberry crops are predicted for Western Washington.

**Hogs Sell Dime Higher This Week.**

An increase of 10,000 hogs to date this month over 40,000 gain for the year looks as if not all the hog raisers had "absolutely" gone out of business yet, says the Portland Live Stock Reporter. The past week wasn't very strong as far as prices were concerned. Barely a nine-cent level was maintained after Monday and from Thursday \$9.95 was about the top.

**Hogs Sell Dime Higher This Week.**

Hog trade opened up briskly on a curtailed receipt basis. Quite a number of hogs were weighed up to packers on arrival, buyers being anxious for their supplies. Packers' first bids were at \$9.95, as high as \$9.95.10 on an excellent load was realized later as the market warmed up. Butcher's bid was up to \$9.10 on ordinary quality. Bulk of the packer stuff, however, brought \$9.95.

**Mohair Season Now Nearly Over.**

Portland.—The few lots of mohair remaining in the Willamette valley are being taken up at reduced prices. The aggregate quantity remaining unsold is small and should quickly be disposed of.

**Fund From Estray Cattle.**

From a fund of \$90,000 received in payment of strayed cattle that roamed the ranges of Montana, all but \$7000 has been paid to rightful owners. When these cattle were shipped the board of stock commissioners stationed at every market point an inspector who took the brand of every animal unloaded from Montana and also received from the commission house a copy of its report, showing the net return for each animal sold.—Portland Live Stock Reporter.

Such pastures not only increase the fertility of the land but also free the sheep from many internal parasites contracted through grazing upon permanent pastures. In particular the use of a succession of forage-crop pastures will prevent stomach worms, one of the most prevalent and disastrous scourges of young stock, and will enable the farmer to market by the end of June or the first of July, when market prices are usually the highest, the lambs that were born in the late winter or early spring.
