cus', town election, etc., provides that notice shall be given in a certain manner, namely by posting. Ignorance of the law excuses no one. If we don't want to abide by the laws of this country, perhaps there are countries which have different laws. A Real Taxpayer.

To The Editor:

I will ask a small amount of space in your paper to reply to "A Long Suffering Taxpayer." After getting all the ink out of his system he surely has a little room to spare to a little logic.

In the first place we will thank him neither our errors or our misdeeds are all that we would like to have there by. Neither are all the houses in the town built according to my style of architecture, and neither do all of the inhabitants of the town measure up to my standard of what I think men and women should measure up to. But these are the things that we have to work with and they are what we have to contend with.

The writer has been present at a great many council meetings during the past year and never at any meeting to his knowledge has this long suffering taxpayer appeared and made complaint in regard to such grievous wrongs as he has suffered.

The city has been seriously hampered for want of funds for street work, but notwithstanding all this there is an unexpended balance in the road fund of about \$800 which is available at any time that we can get crushed rock. Unfortunately we are the victim of the car shortage on the rock question and we have not been able to get any rock at all for use on our streets this season.

We have promise of one carload of crushed rock to use in patching the holes made by the "village plumber" and others and with the exception of the expense for this rock we will have all of our road funds now on hand to put with our next years money and make a nice showing in our city streets with some permanent road work.

In regard to sidewalks I think that the town has made a very good record for itself during the past two or three years. Practically the entire sidewalk of the town has been rebuilt during this period, also a great deal of new walk has been built. There is a little old walk which the writer is aware needs rebuilding, but but we must remember that notwithstanding our present "prosperity" some of our taxpayers and fellow citizens are a little cramped in the purse. With due respect to previous councils, the writer desires to pay a little tribute to the councilmen and mayor who have served during the past year.

It is not necessary to remind the readers of the condition of the city books a year ago now and to the present council belongs the credit of bringing order out of chaos and recovering for the city the money which was due it.

To the present council is due the credit of placing the water system on a paying basis. Instead of facing a deficit of \$800 from our water system as was the case in 1915 we find a small balance on the right side of the ledger, for 1916.

The work of the present council has been of such a character that not much showing is made on the surface, and it has not been the policy of the mayor and councilmen to crow about what they have accomplished.

It will be a long time before this town gets another council who will do their work as conscientiously and as intelligently as the council of 1916. I believe in giving credit where it is due. I do not believe in electing men to a thankless office, without salary, giving them nothing to work with and after they have done their best, giving them a kick for not doing more.

I am sorry that the city has not the finances to publish all notices in our weekly paper but such happens to be the case. The editor very kindly gives the city a great deal of publicity, but there is such a thing as riding a free horse to death. The law in regard to town can-
