High School Visits Vancouver.

The high school boys' and girls' basket ball teams, accompanied by a good representation from the school, made a trip to Vancouver last Friday afternoon where basket ball games were played between the home teams and the Deaf-Mute school at that place. The resulting score was, boys, 46-14 in favor of the Vancouverites, and the girls' score was Beaverton 3—Mutes 4.

Neither game was exceptionally fast, but nevertheless they were interesting. The home boys did well to run up the score they did against their opponents, who have defeated some of the best Portland teams by a more than decisive score. Their team work was very good and with it they succeeded in tangling our boys up several times. Nevertheless when they play on the home floor here a week from Friday night there may be a different story to tell.

The girls' game was considerably slower owing in part to the inexperience of the two teams, as this was the initial appearance of each. Their team work, tactics, and appearance on the floor was anything but suggestive of a well-balanced team, and as for playing they depended on sheer force, weight, and strong arm playing to pile up the score. To have played after the style prescribed by the rule book would have meant an overwhelming defeat for them, because the high school girls, though of little experience and lacking the guiding hand of a first class coach, have developed team work and the fundamentals of a good game to a fair degree. Other than the basket ball games, the visitors were royally entertained by Mr. Clarke, the superintendent of the institution, and his wife assisted by the teachers.
