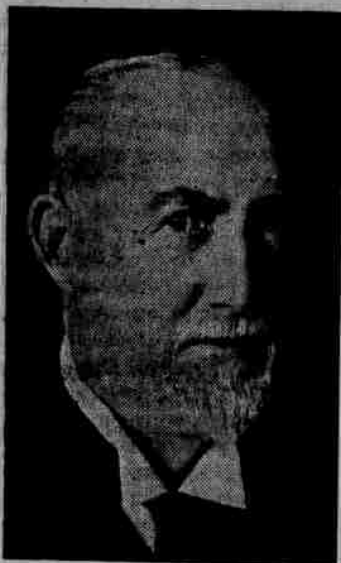

Long Beach, Cal.—Editor Times: How are you? I just received a copy of the Beaverton Times, was sure glad to hear of the Times coming back again. If you do not know me just go to Jake Stroud and George Thompson, they will tell you enough. This is a fine country if you have the price. We were fixing to go back to Oregon when the landlord put the rent up so they saw we would go then down went the rent, so we will stay longer. We get homesick to see Beaverton as to hear the barking of a dog from there. Would like to see the rains come down again. I would not trade my place there for 160 acres here and have to live on it. There is lots of flowers and sunshine but you pay for it. I run a machine here that cooks and presses the oil out of sardines, cook forty tons per day. The canneries are running full time, there are five large canneries in Long Beach. They work sardines now, will not be long till the tuna comes. My Sunday School class today had 241 men in it, the largest class on the coast. G. P. Taubman is our teacher and preacher, the leading preacher of Long Beach. Will preach tonight in the auditorium on the pier to 3500 people. How can we get away from a place like this? Our health is good, can eat lots if we do not forget to get it on porkless day. I think we will leave here this spring, will go east for the summer. Our love and best wishes to old time friends. T. J. Allen and Wife.
