county last week looking up the herds of Jerseys here with a view of buying a carload or more for the dairymen of his county. He was much impressed with the quality of the herds here and we may expect to hear from him again soon. In Umatilla County there is the only successful bull association that has been operating in the Northwest for the past two years. They have five blocks organized and have five bulls purchased and the results are proving exceptionally satisfactory to the farmers there.

County Threshermen Set Prices

At a meeting of the threshermen of Washington County at Hillsboro last Friday evening, a schedule of prices for the season of 1918 was established as follows:

In the valley—Oats, 4 cents per bushel; wheat 5 cents per bushel; minimum charge for setting, \$10.

In the hills—Oats, 5 cents per bushel; wheat 6 cents per bushel; minimum charge for setting, \$14.

Weights per bushel were set at 36 pounds for oats and 61 pounds for wheat.

The prices set are a raise of approximately 30 per cent over last year's charges and should appear fair to all concerned, as labor is higher and repair bills for the machines are much higher than previously.

Realizing the responsibility of the thresherman in saving food, it was decided to have all machines in the best of repair in order that the best job possible may be done for each farmer, and in order to insure a uniform quality of work, the matter was put up to the food administration to license each machine to do first-class work and thus provide that any machine that was kept in first-class repair for

the entire season would be denied its license to continue. If the food administration is willing to do this, such a course will be followed.

The threshermen also wish to have the farmers realize that the necessity to save food also imposes upon the farmer the responsibility of keeping grain to the machines so that they can be fed steadily and thus kept going.

The plan to district the county was discussed, but owing to the lateness in the season and the proposal to have the food administration license the machines, it was left to the honor of the threshermen to stay in the districts closest to their own homes until those districts are threshed out.

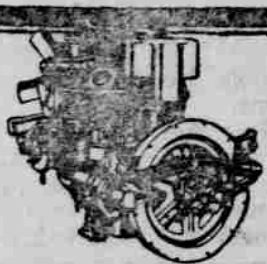
