CAPTAIN SWENSON GIVEN A MAJOR'S COMMISSION

Son of Well-Known Beaverton Man Promoted for Service in Argonne Forest.

ambulance service and was assigned to the 91st division. Last April his excellent work was recognized and he was made a captain.

In the unfortunate advance into the Argonne Forest, his was the only dressing station that advanced into the shell-swept and bullet-riddled area. As he sat in his tent giving orders to his two lieutenants, a German bomb struck it and when he recovered from the effects of the explosion, he found that he had been only stunned but that his two companions had fared worse. One had made the supreme sacrifice and the other had suffered severe wounds. Hastily setting up his station he operated on the wounded lieutenant and then for hours that seemed like ages, without rest or sleep, he cared for the wounded men as they were brought in. He has no idea how many he treated, but reports from the front have alleged that of the 28,000 men who fearlessly faced the foe, but barely 8,000 returned unhurt.

But meagre details are now available and Major Swenson is rather reticent and but little inclined to dilate upon his exploits, but when the history of this war is written, the story of Argonne Forest will be another chapter in American valor and the name of the surgeon who served so well will not go unmentioned.

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Parties Interested May See it Work and Know for Themselves What it Will Do.

Owing to the fact that some unreliable statements have been made against the Fordson Tractor, I take pleasure to advise to whom it may concern:

That I am the owner of a Fordson Tractor and if I had to do without it now, taking everything into consideration, I would quit farming. I can plow 8 acres in 10 hours and do that easy, or I can plow 16 acres in 20 hours without stopping except changing drivers. I can also plow any time that you can plow with horses.

I dug my potatoes with a Fordson Tractor and a Hoover Potato Digger, and we plowed 4 acres every evening after dark. I put 2000 feet of rough lumber on my wagon and got stuck with the wheels sunk between 6 to 8

inches in the ground and had a 3200 pound team. I hitched on to it with the Fordson and hauled it out the first pull.

I can plow my land for 40 to 50 cents per acre for just what fuel and oil against \$2.50 to \$3.00 per acre with horses.

In my opinion there is not a better 2 plow tractor on the market today or any comparison to it.
