

School Is Closed.

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Be it further resolved that the Mayor of the said Town of Beaverton, Oregon, is hereby empowered to appoint such special officers as he may deem advisable for the enforcement of the provisions of this resolution, and

Be it further resolved that the Health Officer of the Town of Beaverton is hereby authorized and instructed to quarantine all persons whom he shall know or suspect to be afflicted with Spanish Influenza and all persons coming in direct contact with the disease or inhabiting domiciles where the disease may exist.

Be it further resolved that an emergency exists and this resolution be and the same is in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage by the Council.

Replying to the action of the Town authorities, the School Board met this (Friday) evening and the following resolution was moved by Director Hocken, seconded by Director Davis and unanimously carried:

Whereas, the Town Council has passed resolutions in accordance with the wishes of the School Board as expressed at a special meeting of said School Board held Friday, January 13, and closing all public and private gatherings and enforcing a strict quarantine for the purpose

of stamping out the Spanish Influenza in this community,

BE IT RESOLVED that the School Board cooperate with said Town Council by ordering the schools closed and pledge its cooperation so long as said orders shall be enforced.

Horseradish Harvested.

E. Grandgeorge and S. H. Zimmerman have just finished harvesting five acres of horseradish and have the crop under cover.

Horseradish is one of the profitable crops of this section and the grower who has a few acres of this popular relish is assured of a sure crop and a ready market.

The average yield of horseradish in this section from the lands suited to its growth is from one and one-half to two and one-half tons per acre. The root finds a ready sale at prices ranging in the vicinity of \$160 per ton, so the yield per acre is between \$250 and \$400 per acre, while the labor cost of producing it at prevailing prices is about \$100 per acre.

The crop is practically drought-proof, as the long roots go deep for moisture and the plants do not dry out even when other crops fail.

Messrs. Grandgeorge and Zimmerman expect to have sets for about 15 acres next season.

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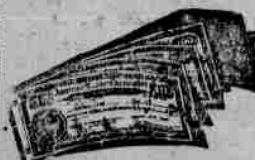
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
