SOIL SCHOOL PLANNED.

A two days' Soil School has been planned for Scholl's, to study such subjects as "Formation and Classification of Washington County Soils, Soil Improvement, The Use of Fertilizers in Washington County, Crop Rotation, Use of Farm Manures and other subjects of equal interest to farmers of Washington County.

This school is to be held under the auspices of the Washington County Farm Bureau, and a committee of leading farmers from the Western part of the county is being appointed to make necessary arrangements. W. L. Powers, Professor of Soils, and C. V. Ruzek, Professor of Soil Fertility, will be present to give lectures on these subjects and Farm Drainage will also be discussed.

The dates for the school are March 14th and 15th. Sessions will begin at 10:00 A. M. and close at 4:00 P. M. Place of meeting has not been decided but definite notice will be given later.
